

201 The last Will and Testament of Daniel Garrison Esq^r
I Daniel Garrison of the State of Pennsylvania and County of Lancaster
knowing that it is appointed unto all men to die, and being
by the blessing of God of sound mind and memory do make
publick and declare this to be my last will and testament
in the following that is to say.

1^o It is my Will that my executors to be here after appointed
pay all my just debts and funeral expenses out of my estate.
2^o I wish my executors to sell my perishable property to the highest
bidder on a twelve months credit.

3^o I wish my executors to hire my Negro privately until
such time as my executors may think it prudent to sell
them, then I wish them to be sold to the highest bidder on
twelve months time.

4^o I wish my executors to sell my land in a way so as
not to injure or exhaust it until such time as they
may think it prudent and advisable to sell the same
then I wish my executors to sell said land on one two
and three years time.

5^o I wish the 1000 dollars resulting from the sale of the above
property to be equally divided among my wife Nancy
Garrison and all my children and at the death of my
dear wife Nancy gave I wish the portion given
to her in the above will or so much of the same as may
remain in her hands at the time of her death to be equally
divided among all my children.

And lastly I constitute and appoint John Owen Joseph Garrison
J. A. George my Executors of this my last Will
and Testament of which whereof I have hereunto set my
hand and seal this 18th day of October 1857
