5th I desire that all my stock on hand and my dower and my negroes to wit Sylvia & Henry to be sold and the proceeds to be divided equally divided between all my heirs to wit John B. Hamilton Susan A. Timmins the heirs of William B. Hamilton deceased, David R. Hamilton James G. & Samuel P. Hamilton said negro girl Sylvia and boy Henry and dower are to be sold by my Executors.

6th I appoint H. B. Cowen and John B. Hamilton Executors to this my last will
7th I declare this my last will

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during her life, and as I am desirous that my family should be settled on a farm of their own provided it dont cost more than five thousand dollars, I therefore appoint Robert Drummam James C. English and O. B. Wiley to purchase said farm, so soon as it can be done to the best advantage of my estate, in which farm when purchased my wife is to inherit as above directed and lastly I nominate James C. English sole Executor of this my last will and testament in witness whereof I James P. Cloughran have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal the 29th day of April in the year of our Lord Eight hundred and sixty eight sealed and published in our presence and we have hereunto subscribed our names in the presence and at the request of the Testator, the day and date above written.
