do make this my last will and testament
1st I desire that all my just debts be paid
2nd I give and bequeath the whole of my property both
real and personal to my wife and my nine children
to wit, Alfred Jan^y John Frank Martin James
Laura Virginia & the youngest child now living
which has not been named together with any children
I may hereafter have, said property to be equally
divided among my wife & my said children and
should any of my said children die before attaining
to the age of twenty one unmarried then the share
which I have bequeathed to such child shall
be equally divided among the balance of my
said children. Witness my hand & seal this 2^d

to be and constitute a part of my former will
by me executed bearing date 2^d September 1842
It is my will and desire that that the property given
to my daughters named in said former will
and those born after the date thereof go to them
to their sole and separate use. And I hereby
will and desire that my daughter Margaret
Davidson come in and share equally with
my other children in my property - her portion
to go to her to her sole and separate use during
her life and at her death to go to her children
now living and any that may be hereafter born
of her body - her portion however to be subject
to a deduction for the foregoing claims and
debts. I regard the account of James
M. Davidson due to J. G. Goodrich & Co.

Also two notes and interest thereon for about one hundred and
fifty dollars each executed by James M. Davidson to my
John & Fulton also a private account of my daughter
Margaret Davidson's with J. G. Goodrich & Co. of from one
hundred and fifty to one hundred and eighty dollars
Also the sum of \$1300 for the support in a great measure
of the family of said James M. Davidson for about five
and a half years as advancement to my said daughter
Margaret Davidson
I also give to my said daughter Margaret Davidson
to her sole and separate use during of her life and
at her death to her children the same and let
where she now resides in the town of Fayetteville
to be regarded as an advancement to her and
to be deducted from her portion in the division of
of my property. I also will desire that all
my children except Robt. Kate Charles and Victoria
be charged two thousand dollars each for money
expended in their education and I will that my
daughter Victoria be charged \$750 for monies
expended in her education which advancements
for education are to be deducted from their
portion of property giving to each respectively
in the division
It is my will and desire that my law library
shall not be sold and I hereby give the same
to my son.

In relation to the bequest and services to my
wife in my said former will I hereby make
the following alteration and in addition
to the bequests and devises therein named
I give to her my boy Jo during her life and
at her death to my daughter Laura, the
value of said boy to be deducted from the
portion given to my said daughter Laura
his value to be estimated at the time of delivery
I also give and devise to my wife such of
my house hold and kitchen furniture as
she may desire to keep.

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I also give and devise to her my tract of land
on Farm including the land recently purchased
from Robert Henry on the South side of Elk
river, Also my ferry place lying some 30 or 40
acres bounded on the east by the lands formerly
owned by John Burke, on the South by the
river on the west by my old tract on the north
by the Corporation of Fayetteville during her
natural life. It is also my will and desire
that my farm on the north & south sides of Elk
river be carried on the present year before
any division - And my Cattle and mules sold
for cash here or elsewhere by my Executors for
paying my debts.

The Last Will of Sarah Childs dec'd

Sarah Childs of Cinchona County and State of Tennessee
being of sound mind and disposing memory, do make and
publish this to be my last will and Testaments hereby
revoking all others and former wills,
First I will that all my funeral expenses & great debts
be paid by my Executors, hereinafter named as
soon after my death as convenient. I also will that
my Executors have placed over my grave a Tombstone
or monument such as my property and condition in
life may justify as suitable and proper.

Second I give and bequeath and devise to my son
Marion Childs the following named property
a tract of land which I bought of the Marion
Childs on the day of October 1849 known by the
Arrens tract and joining the tract on which I am
now living on the north, and is supposed to contain
two hundred and ninety four Acres. Also one hundred
Acres out of the tract on which I am now living and
joining the Arrens tract on the north - the line to common
at the north west corner of the Arrens tract, and
run north and East to the east line of the tract
