In the name of God Amen. I John Duddley of the
County of Lincoln & State of Tennessee Being weak
in body But of sound mind & disposing memory
& Calling to mind the uncertainty of human life
and being desirous do dispose of all such worldly substance
as it hath pleased God to bless me with in manner
following to wit, that is to say after all my just debts is
paid I will and desire that my wife Nancy
McDudley have my Land & Farm & Farming Tools
and all my household & Kitchen furniture and all
my Stock of Horses, cattle Sheep & hogs her naturally
from my wedlock

2^d I will and desire that my Son Ignatius have Fifty cent
& I will & desire that my son James D. Duddley have fifty cent
& I will and desire that my son Wiley Duddley have Fifty cent
& I will and desire that my daughter Polly Mitchell have Fifty cent
& and at my wife death my property to be Equally divided
Between the Balance of my Children so with
Elizabeth William, John S. Nicolas & Virgil A. Stew
7 and lastly I constitute and appoint my friend John
F. Cawser & Nancy M. Duddley Executors to this my last will
and testament hereby Revoking all other or former wills
or Testaments by me heretofore made in testimony
whereof I have hereunto set my hand & affixed my seal
this Ninth day of April 1830.

Last Will & Testament of John King —
I John King do hereby make & set forth this my last
Will & Testament, hereby revoking all other wills by
me at any time made

1st I beg with my soul to God who gave it

2^d I direct that my funeral expenses & all my debts shall
be paid out of the first money that may come into the
hands of my Executors

3^r I direct that all my property both real & personal of every
description shall be sold in the following manner to my
Executors shall give 30 days notice in some newspaper
in this County of the time & day set all on the premises
the land one & two years time & the balance one &
gives time the land to be disposed & sold in two tracts one
containing one hundred & twenty five Acres known as the
Stile house place which I bought from Pitts & the balance
two hundred & fifteen Acres in two tracts to be sold together as
above in 18 2 years time & the Negroes & other property on
one years time

4^t I direct the proceeds arising from the sale of my
property of every description shall be equally divided among
my children & heirs to wit, Ignatius King who lives in
Alabama George King also a citizen of Alabama

Mark King a citizen of Missouri

Mary Ward wife of E. C. Ward and the heirs of my
son Aaron King & of my daughter Martha Morrison
to have respectively the amt, that my son and daughter
would be entitled to if living

Lastly I appoint W. M. Morrison my Executor
to this my Will
