I Thomas C. Davis do make and publish this my last Will
and Testament hereby revoking all former Wills by me heretofore made. First - It is my Will that all my just debts
be paid as soon after my death as practicable, out of the first
monies that come into the hands of my Executor herein.
After neared. - Second, I hereby give to my faithful friend
Miss Mary Alyon, the sum of Five hundred Dollars, to be paid
to her in the sum of fifty Dollars per year, commencing twelve
months after my death. It is my wish her receipts should
be given a general annual sum than for my Executor until
pay the sum until the whole \$500 are exhausted. -

Third, I hereby direct my Executor to pay the sum of \$500
to the Cumberland Presbyterian Theological School in Lebanon
Tennessee to be paid only when it shall be ascertained that said
School has a permanent existence. - Fourth, I hereby give and
bequeath all the residue of my estate both real and personal
to my only Brother Marcus L. Davis, with this request of this
injunction upon him that he will keep all the slaves together
without the misfortune or expense of the slaves should be taken
presently to dispose of such a one.

Fifth, I hereby nominate my Brother Marcus L. Davis my sole
Executor of this my last Will and Testament

I John S. Henderson do make and ordain this my last Will
and Testament revoking all other made by me at any time
First - It is my wish that my said and the following negroes my
slaves, Harry, Calow, Currie, Linda and her child, Marshall,
Eliza, Malista, George, Odeman, Jerry, Bob, Sue and a demand
the proportion of my wife Priscilla and my eight children
Sarah, James, C. William, A. Barb, Lebaria & John C.
Victoria & Sophia, Henderson and my household to take
possession into all the stock and farming Utensils, that my
wife may think proper to keep during my wife's natural
life and in her widowhood, if she makes all the above named
property to be divided giving her a Child's part or at her
death it all is to be equally divided among my children
above named. It is my wish that Zack, Aaron, Francis &
Dennis together with the balance of the stock and remainder of
the present Crop after a year provision for the family and
paying off the eight^h of the Cotton and Ninth of the
Corn if he work till the Crop is gathered be sold by my
Executor and pay all my just debts. It is my wish that
Third Negro left in the proportion of my wife and children
be hired out from year to year if it is thought advisable
by my wife and Executor to defray the expenses of the
family. I also nominate and appoint Dennis & Henderson
my Executor to this my last Will and Testament - and
testimony whereof I have signed this my hand and seal this day
19th 1855
