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Eliza Phagan, Sarah A. Wiley, and the three minor children of my daughter Nancy, halloway, now deceased. Each of the above named heirs to receive one seventh of the value of the negro, except the minor of my daughter Nancy, who is to receive jointly one seventh as the others. Nothing ~~for~~ *pro rata*.  
Thirdly I direct that all of my personal property together with one lot in the Town of Camargo be sold, except one bed bedstead and furniture which I give to my negro leaved servant to be of the value of twenty five dollars, also I give to my four Daughters all my bed clothes, table cloths towels, &c. to be equally divided among them selves, and it is to be distinctly understood that all & every of the above bequests made to my four Daughters is for their own special use and benefit & theirs heirs after them.

Lastly I nominate and appoint John P. Haughman Sole Executor of this my last will.

Warkins I further wish and desire that these lands be valued by three disinterested men who are competent judges and free holders of Lincoln County Tenn, and S. M. Warkins to receive his half by valuation in the lands when he now lives, Also Susan A. Glack & C. H. Warkins to receive their half in the lands on which I now live, but is to be valued as above described. The party who receives the tract of land valued the highest pays over to the other party until they are equal, 6<sup>th</sup> It is my further wish and desire that my lower plantation, it being a part of Joseph Warkins dec<sup>d</sup> Old Mill tract to be sold to the highest bidder on a credit of one two & three years time to be sold at a suitable time next Fall and the proceeds to be equally divided between James Warkins my sister receiving one third my sister in law Margaret Warkins Widow of Daniel A.
