This allmening thus presents that I Josiah Gibson do make this as my last Will and Testament revoking all others made by me at any time made — I Will and bequeath my Negro Men Peter and my Negro Woman Land to my Father Thomas Gibson and Mahala Gibson my children during their lives term, and at his death to Thomas Gibson my Brother — I give my Beard called Longnose to my Sister Margarette M. Gibson, my Pennsylvania filly to Thomas M. Gibson, my Chincasum filly to James L. Gibson and my bucking Cott to Thomas Gibson — I direct that all the rest of my Horses and cattle, Hogs and Cows be sold to the highest bidder — I direct that Sarah Smith be paid for the rent of the wheat ground which I rented of her out of the proceeds of the wheat which I direct to be sold for that purpose — I further direct that my Land and all my other effects not otherwise be named in this Will be sold to the highest bidder

## Last Will of Jackson Luttrell

This being my last Will and Testament — I want my debts paid out of my perishable property the first thing and all the balance of my property to go into my wife's hands her life time Newton Luttrell appointed Executor this Octo 5<sup>th</sup> 1856

## Last Will & Testament of W. P. Ross deceased

I William P. Ross do make and publish this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking and making void all other Wills by me at any time made

Firstr — I direct that my funeral expenses and all my debts be paid as soon after my death as possible out of any Money that I may owe paper of or may forth come into the hands of my Creditors and to effect this object I wish my executors to sell any property that I may have or paper of at private or public sale as they may deem best for that purpose and collect all debts due and of every kind —

Second — I direct that my Office & Office furniture be sold upon such terms as my Executors may think proper

Third — I own a tract of land containing about one half section situated in the State of Alabama — I also own a tract of land lying in Lincoln County Tennessee containing about one hundred and forty or fifty acres, the same and left — Now I do authorize my Executors to sell said land upon such terms as they may think proper — The the acre tract lying in Lincoln County I have traded one half of it to George McWhorter — when White pays to my wife Eighty Dollars with Interest thereon from the 1<sup>st</sup> day of January 1852 then and Executors will convey to said White an undivided half of said Land — I also own by contract with John Mc Bright about three acres of land adjoining the house and lots in which I now live in the Town of Fayetteville on the North side of said lots — I hereby authorize my Executors to lay off said lots into three or four lots and sell one or more of the same either for Cash or on a credit and convey the same to the purchaser — The which shall be laid off adjoining the lot wherein I now live on the North shall be attached to and form a part of the said lot upon which I now live and shall be disposed of with said lot as hereinafter directed

Fourth — As soon after my death as convenient I wish my executors to collect my books together and if either one or more of my Sons are reading Law I should give to such Son or Sons all my elementary books including the Principals Report — The balance of my books I desire shall be sold with my office furniture as provided in clause Second — At my death I give my Watch to my son William P. Ross — Fifth — After all my debts are paid and the special bequests before provided shall be delivered — It is my will and desire that my wife Martha C. Ross have all my property absolutely to dispose of as she pleases except my slaves and my house and lots in the Town of Fayetteville
