Second - I give and bequeath to my Daughter Elizabeth who intermarried
with Charles McRatt the sum of five dollars in Gold
Thirdly - I give and bequeath to my Daughter Christopher who intermarried
with George Brown the sum of five dollars in Gold
Fourthly - I give and bequeath to my Daughter Martha who intermarried
with Benjamin Downing the sum of five dollars in Gold
Fifthly - I give and bequeath to my Daughter Mary who intermarried
with George Bedwell the sum of five dollars in Gold
Sixthly - I give and bequeath to my Daughter Sarah who intermarried
with John Peet the sum of five dollars in Gold
Seventhly - I give and bequeath to my Daughter Nancy who intermarried
with William McRatt the sum of five dollars in Gold
Eighthly - I give and bequeath to the wife of my son Miles White the
sum of five dollars in Gold

Ninthly - I give and bequeath to my Daughter Letitia who intermarried
with William White all of my land estate it being in four several
tracts containing in all one hundred and fifty acres and all
my household & Kitchen furniture and also five dollars in gold
and lastly I do hereby nominate and appoint Thos S. Williams
my Executor. In witness whereof I do to this my Will the
second and last Will the 1st day of April 1852
