

Least Will and Testament of P. M. Harper and
J. P. M. Harper a resident of the County of Lincoln in the
State of Pennsylvania being of sound and disposing mind
but failing in body and knowing that his approacheth now
to die; do make and publish this my last Will and Testament
hurly reciting and making record all other Wills by me at
any time made & this; that my funeral expenses and all
my just debts be paid as soon after my death as possible out
of any Money that I may possess of or may then may forth
come into the hands of my Executrix.

Secondly— I give and bequeath to my beloved Companion Nancy
P. Harper all the Money and Stays that I may have on hand
at my decease after all my just debts are paid, and also
all my Land and the following slaves to wit Daniel, Nelson,
Henry, Lucinda and her three Children, Jane and her Child
during her natural life in Wisconsin.

Thirdly— I give and bequeath to my Daughter Martha E. Jacobs to
be taken up immediately after my death a Slave named Odessa and to the heirs of her
body and one hundred and ten Dollars that her husband
Henry Jacobs is owing me, also the amount that the said
H. Jacobs is indebted to me for a small piece of land lying
East of a Creek which I sold him.

Fourthly— I give and bequeath to my two young sons, Thomas M.
and George P. Harper four hundred Dollars apiece for
completing their education.

Fifthly— After the death of my Companion I will that my three
sons to wit A. W. H. M. and James P. Harper have all
my lands as tenants in common and that my Daughter
Eliza & Shaw shall have the one fourth part of the
value of the above named Slave not specifically devised
and the balance equally among A. W. H. M. James P. Harper
Now should any of my Sons die without leaving a living
Child and my wife still living and widow, I will
that his or their effects or estate shall descend equally to
my Companion and those that are surviving my Sons
All the surplus Stock and perishable property that I may
have on hand at my death that is not necessary to have
to carry on the farm shall be sold by my Executrix upon a
crisis of twelve Months to the highest bidder and the proceeds
equally divided among all my children. I wish my son
A. W. Harper to remain with his mother and superintend in

carrying on the farm as he has hitherto done.
I hereby do hereby nominate and appoint James A. Wright my
Executor. In testimony whereof I do to this my last Will set my
hand and seal. All erasures and interlineations made before
signing and witnessed this 1st January 1859.
