5th I will that my Executors shall take into his possession at the end
of the present year my house and lot and Negro Bay Harry and
that he rent the house to the highest bidder and have out there ^{house} Bay
and that from the rents of the house and the hire of Negro Bay he
shall reserve such an amount as may be necessary to finish the house
in two years. — " — " — " — "

At the end of two years I have it discretionary with my Executors
either to sell my house and lot, and Negro Boy Harry, or to continue
to rent and hire; if sold the proceeds I wish to be equally divided
between my four children, Susan Ann, Mary Jane, Eliza Washington
and Thomas Wyatt.

7th I wish my Character to live the Negro Boy either publicly or privately
as he may think the interest of my Children may demand

8 - I want all my perishable property sold and proceeds applied to the payment of my debts; — " — "

9- I think my Beds, Bedsteads and household property divided among my Children

after my death shall have been fulfilled; all the rest of my effects of
every description situated both Real and Personal be given to my
Nephew James Foster, son of Isaac Foster, for the love and affection
I entertain for him as a relation and for his services to me during the
remainder of my life. I further do here appoint my Nephew James
Foster my sole Executor of this my last Will and testament this
