1st I desire that just debts and funeral expenses be paid
2^d I give & bequeath my two Cows and all my hogs, and
my house held & Kitchen furniture to my beloved wife

3rd I desire that all the rest of my property be sold at
public auction on a twelve months Credit and the proceeds
thereof placed in the hand of my beloved Brother Wiley G.
Melan who I hereby make my Executor
It I wish all my Estates and money on hand placed in brother
Wiley G. Melan hands and I want him after paying my
debts to buy a home and a negro girl for the benefit
of my beloved wife Margot & my daughters Betsey
and Mary and my sons James Wiley & Madison
Alexander, and in the event my wife Margot should
disease or Marry then the home & Negro to be sold and
divided Equally to be sale and divided equally between
my two daughters Betsey & Mary & my two Sons James Wiley
and Madison Alexander if my wife Margot live
single until my son Madison Alexander becomes
of lawfull age then I wish the Negro and lands
sold and the proceeds thereof equally divided between
my wife Margot and my daughters Betsey & Mary
and my Sons Madison Alexander & James Wiley Melan
I want the Negro to work with Brother Wiley G.
claim for the support of my wife Margot and
my Sons and daughters above named This September

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William Bright Inv. Last Will and Testament
I William Bright Inv. of the City of Louisville and State of Kentucky
concerning the uncertainty of this mortal life, and being of
sound mind and memory, do make and publish this my
Last Will and Testament, hereby revoking and making void
all former Wills by me at any time made in manner and
form as following

First I direct that all my Just debts and funeral expenses be paid
as soon after my death as possible out of any money that
I may die Seized of, or may first come into the hands
of my Executor.

Secondly I do hereby give and bequeath to my Son William
D. Bright, all that part of my lands, lying South and
East of the following named line, including the house and
tract which I bought from William Stephens, to begin
at a rock standing in the east boundary line, of my
two hundred acre tract, and South west corner of
William Stephens land, and the North West corner of the
above named seven acre tract, to run South to a
Stake standing near a creek, the corner of a twenty
acre tract that I bought of Butler, thence a South
West direction, to a Stake Standing in the land bearing
from my house to Mr Vaughn, at eleven poles East
direction from Peter cabin, thence with the center of
said land to a Stake Standing two poles from Sarah
Vaughn North boundary line, and near a big tree,
running from thence West, parallel with Sarah Vaughn
line to a Stake two poles North of Sarah Vaughn
North West corner, thence South two poles from
Sarah Vaughn to a Stake near the New Turnip
Patch, thence a West direction to a Cherry tree
standing in Burks field, from thence a straight
direction to a Bush the South West corner of the
One hundred and ten acre tract which I bought
of said Butler.

Thirdly I do hereby give and bequeath to my
son James Bright all the remainder of my land
lying North and West of the above designated line
Also I give and bequeath to my said son James
my Negro man Peter and Negro woman Rachael
to be his, with the condition that he pay back

to my estate One hundred dollars, twelve months
after my decease, also one third of the present ^{young} Crop.
Corn Cotton and Wheat, and my two horses called
Bell Jones & Bina past, two Calves & Calves, ten head
of Sheep, ten Pork Hogs, two Hens & two Shits, also
all my Kitchen furniture, One Bed Bedstead &
furniture, One Prip and Wore, One Table, One Bureau,
One Clock, One half dozen Chairs, and the water vessels
and One Sheet quin, two Camy Pillows two buttons
and two Pair of Guards, two axes two hoes, and one
Mattock. I also give and bequeath to my daughter
Catherin Carty, four hundred dollars in money.
I give and bequeath to my daughter Nancy Crawford
and her heirs three hundred and fifty dollars in money
I give and bequeath to my son Charles Bright two hun-
dred dollars in money. I give and bequeath to my
grand son Joseph D Williams One hundred dollars
in money. I give and bequeath to my grand son
Rice Williams One hundred dollars in money
I give and bequeath to my grand daughter Louisiana
Bicks One hundred dollars in money, I give and
bequeath to Elizabeth W. Bicks Fifty dollars in money
and donations in Money to be paid so soon as it
may come into to the hands of my Executor
I also give and bequeath to my grand daughter Mary
Ann Bright One Bed Bedstead and furniture,
Also I give and bequeath my Negro girl Martha to
my son William D Bright. I further direct that any
Balance of Money that may remain in the hands
of my executor after all debts donations and expen-
ses is Paid, shall be equally divided between
my son William and my two daughters Cathern
and Nancy Crawford and her children, I do
hereby authorize and request my Executors him
after named to sell my two negro men Berry &
Sam on a credit of twelve months, I direct that
my Pork Hogs be sold for Cash, and all the
balance of my Property, of every description that
is not named in any aforesaid Will, is to be sold
on a credit of twelve months, no sale to take
place until after the Crop is gathered.

It is my desire and request that my two negro men, Berry &
Sam shall not be sold out of Lincoln County
And lastly I do hereby nominate and appoint my son
Charles Bright and my Cousin James Bright sole executors
of this my last Will and Testament. In witness whereof

this 1st day of September in the year of our Lord Eighteen
hundred and fifty three William Bright and D

equal in the remainder with William D Bright, Cathern
Carty and Nancy Crawford, I further direct that my Execu-
tors or Administrators shall have the power to sell my negro
as directed to be sold and convey the same and further
either of them shall have the right to purchase at their
own sale

I Daniel Lee do make and publish this as my last will
and Testament hereby revoking and replacing this all other
wills by me at any time made.

First I direct that my funeral expenses and all my
debts be paid as soon after my death as possible but
of any money that I may die possessed of or may
first come into the hands of my executors
Secondly, I give and bequeath to my son Samuel
Lee Two dollars.

Thirdly I give and bequeath to my daughter Rutha Lee
eighty dollars and one bed and Bedstead and furniture.
Fourthly I give and bequeath to the sum of my daughter
Ginny Four hundred dollars after deducting twenty
four dollars the amount of the notes that I held
on their father W. J. Williamson from the above named
four hundred dollars.

Fifthly I give and bequeath to my two grand sons
Belvin Lee and Calman Lee, and my grand daughter
Eliza with Williams fifty dollars each.

Sixthly I ordain that all my lands be sold on one
and two years credit and divided in equal payments
the Purchaser giving bond with good and sufficient
Security and a bill retained on the land till the
Purchaseis money is paid.

Seventhly I ordain that my black man Bob
and all my stock and farming tools and house
beds and Kitchen furniture be sold on a twelve
months credit, also any growing crop and grain that
may be growing on my hands' with all other things
that may be of value.

Eighthly, I give and bequeath all the money that
may arise from the above named sales or may be by
me left after paying off the above named sum and
necessary expenses be divided equally between
my son James Lee, and my daughter Elizabeth,

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Asley, Pally Young, Nancy Worley, and Rutha Lee provided
further that Elizabeth Asley shall take my servant boy Sam
at Seven hundred dollars in her part if so much there
be, coming to her; if not the most pay back so as to make
her and the above named Sam, Pally, Nancy and Rutha
equal, provided further that James Lee shall take a note
that I hold on him for One hundred ^{Twenty two} dollars and ten
cents, in his part without interest also Nancy Worley shall
take two notes that I hold on her husband William Worley
for eighty eight dollars, and Ninety Cents, also without interest
lastly I do hereby nominate and appoint B. M. G. Ellings
and S. McCommas my Executors In witness whereof
I do to this my Will set my hand and seal this the
6th day of August 1853.

be attached to and constitute a part of my will to all
intents and purposes this 15th day of November 1852
