It is further my desire that each of the above named children who have received the several sums as stated pay lawful interest on their respective amounts from this date upto the time when final settlement will be made after the death of my dear wife Mary C. White.

And whereas George P. White and Nancy H. Faulkner have departed this life the same being legal heirs of my Estate, it is my desire that Sarah E. White daughter of George P. White have an equal part with the rest of my children after deducting the above named sum of \$377.50 received by G. P. White, and the sum of \$365.00 received by Johnson Faulkner be deducted from the share due G. P. Mahan and F. P.
