that it is allotted for all mortals die I do hereby make ordains and declare this
to be my last will and testament, I first Recommend my soul to God who
Giveth and my Body to the Mother Earth in Christ Jesus in such manner
as my friends may think proper. And Touching my worldly affairs
I will and desire that my property be disposed of and divided in the
manner hereinafter mentioned (to wit)

To the Name of my Daughter Nancy Ann I will and Bequeath the tract
of Land on which William Brown nouches in Gibson County and also
all the money that is on the honor of William Brown which I
have placed there for the Benefit of said heirs I also will unto them
all the property mentioned in a deed of Gift from me to them
say William & Eliza Ann which is numbered in said deed of Gift
with eleven other property that I have Given unto my daughter Nancy

8th I give and bequeath to my son James P^rson two Negroes Little Gate and Little Jerry,

9th I give and bequeath to my son Samuel P^rson three Negroes (one) Green and Ep^rson & Melinda which makes fifteen hundred Dollars to him

10th I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Ann P^rson, five Negroes (one) Bencher, Nancy, J^rson, and Ben, and all the Beds, and furniture and every thing else, I got by her when I married her, also my large Red Stead, Bed & furniture, and the first choice of my stock of horses & two Cows and Calves. Choice of my stock, which makes fifteen hundred Dollars to her - I also lend her the plantation whereon I am now living, during her life or widowhood or my youngest son Samuel arrives to the age of twenty. One year which was taken place first at which time the land is to be sold and the amount arising from said sale is to be equally divided between my wife and each of my children.
