abling them to do so, the above mentioned Charles McGee was
prevailed upon to undertake the settlement of the Estate

of his dec'd Brother the aforesaid Joseph McGee, and
having divided the Negroes belonging to said Estate twelfth and
between the before mentioned heirs & legatees of said Decedent
by their Mutual Consent and agreement and having
delivered one to them respectively the following Negroes
(viz.) To Polly McGee the widow as aforesaid, Jim a Negro
Man about fifty years of age, Ephraim a Negro man
about twenty three years old, Tom a Boy thirteen, Lid a
woman about forty five years, Hannah a woman about
forty, Ails a woman about seventeen and a her child -

To Polly McGee her daughter & legatee as aforesaid,
A Negro Man by the name of Cull forty years old with
a woman upwards of thirty years of age wife of the
said Cull Weston a boy about seven years old of age
Thady a Girl four years old, & Ducey a Girl child about
one year old - To Abner Pruitt & his wife

Nancy, & Polly McGee daughter of said Decedent
a Negro Man by the name of Noah twenty years
old, Spence another Negro Man of the same age
Judah a woman about twenty five years old
George a boy seven years of age Hannah a Girl
two years old, as their part, and a full proportion of
the Negro property belonging to said Estate, now if the
above bound Polly McGee widow as aforesaid, Abner

In the name of God Almighty & Allmerciful, the
 Last will and testament of John Brown the
 Elder of Mills County North Carolina, made and
 concluded in manner and form as follows, My
 Soul I recommend to the God that made and
 preserved me, and my body to be decently buried
 at the discretion of my Executors hereinafter to be
 named, and as to my worldly property that God
 in the course of His providence has blessed me with
 I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Land
 Brown during her natural life the following
 Negroes, Affin Diana for Peter, Maria George and
 James, likewise all the household and kitchen furniture
 also all my stock of Horses, cattle, sheep, and hogs
 with all the farming utensils and at her decease
 the above property to be divided equally between
 my sons, Hugh & Hamilton, Thomas & Allen and
 my Daughters Ann & Margaret, taking from the
 Girls part of the price of two negro girls

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I do hereby direct & command I give to my Daughter
Elizabeth Stewart a negro Girl called Leah to my
Daughter Ann a Girl called Lilly to my Daughter
Margaret a Girl called Linck Thirdly I do hereby will
and direct that all the lands that I hold in the
State of North Carolina including the place whereon
I now live shall be sold by my Executors and the
amount of such sales to be equally divided betwixt
- my Son Hugh, Hamilton, Thomas, Allen, Ann and
Margaret Fourthly It is my will and desire that
all my lands in the state of Tennessee and land
warrants shall be disposed of as follows, the tract of
land on Knob Creek of two thousand acres in my
own name fifteen hundred of which belongs to me
the other five hundred acres belong to my son Allen
- and five hundred acres of said tract I give
to my son Hugh, five hundred acres I give to my
son Hamilton and the other five hundred acres to be
equally divided between my Daughters Ann and
Margaret and my land at the place called the
bent of Rock River of six hundred and two
acres in the name of William Brown whose oblig-
- ation I have for a conveyance I give to my
son John and that all the rest of my lands &
land warrants that I claim in Tennessee shall all
be devised by my Executors as they think proper
amongst my Children: Fifthly It is my will &
- desire that, if the money due me that my
Executors shall pay all my just debts & if any
money remains to be applied to the use of my wife
& my four youngest sons and my two youngest daughters
Sixthly it is my desire that if there is anything
not named in this will that my Executors

shall make the proper disposition of the same for
the use of the legatee. I have heretofore given to my
son James a tract of land worth twelve hundred
Dollars in cash to my son William I gave a tract
of land worth eight hundred Dollars and two hun-
- dred and twenty nine Dollars in cash to my son
Alexander I gave a tract worth one thousand
Dollars and to my Daughter Elizabeth I gave
a tract worth two hundred Dollars and twenty
Dollars in cash -

Seventhy & lastly It is my wish and desire that
if any of the Legatee shall be dissatisfied with
this my last will and testament, that in such
case I wish my Executors and they are specially
directed to be the or they who may be dissatisfied
nothing more than ^{ten} pounds for their full portion
