Recor'ded 20th Dec^r 1823
 In pursuance of an Order of the worshipful Court of Maury County, to us directed, we William Barnes, Samuel H. Williams, William Bradshaw, William Pillow, and John Dodge have this day, valued the Negroes, belonging to the Estate of Green Williamson and lotted them off (as nearly equal as the nature of the case would admit) into nine equal lots, and after setting apart Blake, valued at \$475, Eliza at \$270 and Mobery at \$400, making eleven hundred and forty five Dollars, for the use and benefit of David Martin, in right of his wife Sarah, one of said legatees, which to us appeared necessary, from certain circumstances. We then proceeded to allot off the balance into eight equal lots, which we numbered, beginning at N^o 1, we then proceeded to ballot, in which we

found that Mariah G. Williamson drew tott N^o 1 which was worth valued at \$230, George at \$195, Peg at \$250 and Lewis at \$250 making in all eleven hundred and fifty five Dollars. Rufel M. Williamson drew tott N^o 2, which was Jesse valued at \$350, Fager and Child at \$500, and Beck at \$300 making in all eleven hundred and fifty Dollars. Martha A. Williamson drew tott N^o 3 which was Nelson, valued at \$600 and a Mary and Child, valued at \$550, making in all eleven hundred and fifty Dollars. Ann G. Williamson drew tott N^o 4, which was David valued at \$350, William at \$175, and Sarah at \$350 making in all eleven hundred and fifty five Dollars. Elizabeth P. Williamson drew tott N^o 5, which was Phil valued at \$375, Cherry, at \$425 and Joe at \$425 making in all twelve hundred and twenty five Dollars. William H. Williamson drew tott N^o 6, which was John valued at \$500, Dicy, at \$300 Kinoy, at \$150 and Jimmy, Sarah's child, at \$210, making in all eleven hundred and sixty Dollars. Patsy H. Williamson drew tott N^o 7, which was Sam valued at \$350, Tom at \$550 and Peggy at \$270, making in all eleven hundred and seventy Dollars. J. and apart from each other. Your petitioners therefore pray your worshipps that Commissioners may be appointed by this worshipful Court, to value and make division of said Negroes, among your petitioners according to valuation, share and share alike, and that said Commissioners may set apart to each of your petitioners, his or her share in severalty, to be held, owned and possessed, Separately and apart from the rest, giving to your petitioners Mary Nelson, the widow of said John Nelson dec'd a child's part of said Negroes, to which she is by law entitled, and your petitioners pray that said Commissioners so appointed, by this worshipful Court, may make return of their proceedings to the present term of this Court, and your petitioners as in duty bound will ever pray &c.

Ordered, that the foregoing petition be granted, and that Swan Gardin, Edward W.
