Now I give and bequeath to my grand Daughter, Emily E. Williams at the death of her grand Mother two Negro Slaves little Milly and Maria and should any of the legatees and the property allotted to them should descend to their heirs.

Now, a certain Negro Slave by the name of Rachel and her two Children Abby and Cynthia shall be at liberty and then heirs if any, hereafter and all sent to a free State as soon as practicable either to the State of Ohio or Indiana, or any other free State they may choose to go to.

Now, lastly my will and desire is that all monies arising from the sales of Crops, Stock household and Kitchen furniture that is not disposed of and monies and mtd shall be deposited in the hands of my beloved wife Dolly Williams to dispose of as she may think best and that my sons Edmund and Greenberry Williams attend to the selling of such property Crops &c. Collecting &c. and deposit it with their Mother as mentioned.

Now, furthermore, I appoint my beloved wife Dolly Williams
