In the name of God amen I Peter Hambright of
 Meigs County and State of Tennessee being sick and
 weak of Body but of sound mind and disposing memory
 for which I thank God and calling to the uncertainty of
 human life and being desirous to dispose of all such
 earthly substance as I have pleased God to bless me with
 I give and bequeath to my wife Mary Hambright that
 portion of the land that I now have on from the
 mouth of the Adkinson branch down the River to the corner
 of Mr. Wimpsey's field up the Croge fence that cut
 from the River to the corner of an outside fence then
 for the line to run straight from that place through the
 forest space above Mr. Wimpsey's house to the line
 between me & John Hambright then with the line
 line running East to the Adkinson branch and then
 down the said branch to the mouth during her
 natural life times.
 I give and bequeath to James M. Hambright my son
 that portion of land that lies west of the said
 Mary Hambright, portion the said James M. Hambright

Hambright one Hundred Dollars when she becomes of age or a horse bridle and saddle worth one hundred Dollars. I wish and desire that the gray Mare and the gray filly to be sold and all the Cattle except four Milk Cows and Calves and the largest yoke of Oxen and to sell Eight head of sheep and all the hogs except ten that Mary Hambright will designate for her own use and of family and all the Corn that they will not use to be sold to pay all of her just debts. I wish and desire that all the house furniture and the kitchen furniture and other property be for the use of Mary Hambright and family. I Peter Hambright appoint James M. Thanks be given to God, but calling to mind the mortality of my body that is to say finally and first I give and recommend my soul to God who give it in hope of the resurrection of the dead and as I am such worldly Estate which with it has pleased God to bless me and of which I am possessed it is my will and desire to distribute the same as follows and first I bequeath all my Land or real Estate to my wife Peggy Kirkpatrick during her natural life and at her death I will and bequeath all my Land or real Estate to my son John under the restrictions to be hereafter mentioned. I will and bequeath all my personal property as he equally divided among my four Daughters Emeline Caroline Amelie and Mary Alexander Black at the death of my wife Peggy Kirkpatrick but I will that my wife Peggy Kirkpatrick shall have the use and disposal of all my personal property during her life so that an equal proportion shall fall to the above named Daughters at her death. I have already given to my Daughters Harriet property to the value of one Hundred and fifty Dollars which I will and bequeath to her as her full proportion and share of my estate.
