I John Quencer of the County of Miami and State of
 Tennessee calling to mind the uncertainty of human
 life, and being low in health but sound in mind
 and disposing of my money and being desirous to dispose
 of such matters and things as it has pleased God
 to bless me with, Will and bequeath in manner
 following. (w)

That immediately after my decease as much of
 my personal property be sold as shall be sufficient
 to pay my just debts and funeral expenses, I further
 Will and bequeath that all the remainder of my
 property both real and personal be kept together
 for the benefit and support of my wife Betsey
 Quencer and those of my children that may remain
 at home with her during her life and after
 the decease of my wife Betsey I will and bequeath
 unto my daughter Polly Pickle in addition
 to what she has already got one dollar to my
 daughter Nancy Pickle in addition to what she
 has already got one dollar to my daughter
 Peggy Ward in addition to what she has already
 got one dollar; and I will and bequeath to my
 my little daughter Betsey Quencer a horse saddle
 and Bridle worth seventy five dollars four head
 of cattle and two feather Beds and furniture when
 she marries or becomes of age to my daughter
 Polly Pickle in addition to what she has already
 got one dollar I further Will and bequeath that
 after the decease of my wife Betsey whatever of
 my personal property remains and my land be equally
 divided between my four Sons (w) George M Quencer
