6th I Will and bequeath to my daughter Emeline and Eliza my black woman Rofay, and also my black girls Julian and that she pay over to my Executors one hundred dollars within twelve months after my death.

7th I Will and bequeath to my son Zebariah education my black boy, Philip and him pay over to my Executors one hundred dollars within twelve months after my death one half to be paid in cash and the other half in trade.

8th I Will and bequeath to my Son Benjamin T. Martin my yellow girl Rachel and him pay over to my Executors one hundred dollars in cash within twelve months after my death.

9th I Will and bequeath that the above named Eliza Emeline Jane Eliza Zebariah Martin and Benjamin T. Martin take possession of the above named negro at the time of my death.

10th I Will and bequeath all the rest and residue of my property to my three children namely Caroline Garrison Rebecca Garrison and Maria Jones to be equally divided amongst them, and then here after them I hereby constitute and appoint my Sons Benjamin T. Martin and Zebariah my Executors to execute the provisions of this my last Will and Testament in thing whosoever I have to set my hand and seal and affixed my seal this 24th day of May 1843.
