

# Sarah Martin Reed Will

Known all men by these presents that I Sarah Martin of the County of Wmms and State of Tennessee being aged and infirm but of sound and disposing mind and memory realizing the uncertainty of life and the certainty of death, and wishing to dispose of the property and effects which it has pleased Providence to bless me in such manner as to avoid litigation and disputes when I shall be called hence, do hereby for that purpose make, execute and publish this my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking any and every former Will or Wills and Testaments by me at any time heretofore made, executed, and published.

First I Will and bequeath my soul to my God who gave it, and my body to the Earth to be decently interred.

2<sup>nd</sup> I Will and bequeath that my funeral expenses as to my debt of any at the time of my death shall first be paid out of the proceeds of my Estate.

3<sup>rd</sup> I Will and bequeath to the heirs of my deceased Son R. H. Martin namely Melinda Williams and Sarah each one dollar.

4<sup>th</sup> I Will and bequeath to the heirs of my deceased Son Thomas J. Martin namely Caroline, William, George and Thomas each one dollar.

5<sup>th</sup> I Will and bequeath to my two grand sons James and William Sons of my deceased daughter Caroline each one feather Bed and a fourmeters.

6<sup>th</sup> I Will and bequeath to my daughter Emeline and Eliza my black woman Rofay, and also my black girls Julian and that she pay over to my Executors one hundred dollars within twelve months after my death.

7<sup>th</sup> I Will and bequeath to my son Zebariah education my black boy, Philip and him pay over to my Executors one hundred dollars within twelve months after my death one half to be paid in cash and the other half in trade.

8<sup>th</sup> I Will and bequeath to my Son Benjamin T. Martin my yellow girl Rachel and him pay over to my Executors one hundred dollars in cash within twelve months after my death.

9<sup>th</sup> I Will and bequeath that the above named Eliza Emeline Jane Eliza Zebariah Martin and Benjamin T. Martin take possession of the above named negro at the time of my death.

10<sup>th</sup> I Will and bequeath all the rest and residue of my property to my three children namely Caroline Garrison Rebecca Garrison and Maria Jones to be equally divided amongst them, and then here after them I hereby constitute and appoint my Sons Benjamin T. Martin and Zebariah my Executors to execute the provisions of this my last Will and Testament in thing whosoever I have to set my hand and seal and affixed my seal this 24<sup>th</sup> day of May 1843.
