"Know all Men by these presents that of James Browder of the County of Meigs and State of Tennessee being sick and weak in body strong and sound in mind taken into consideration the uncertainty of life even whilst in health and much greater when the body is racked with painful disease I have thought it my duty whilst I have strength and perfect soundness of mind to arrange my worldly concerns so far as is comprised here after in this instrument of writing and wish it to be considered by my heirs and Executors as my last will and testament and here by Request each and every one of them to so regard and if there should be any lack of legal force or expression to take now advantage of it but to bury my remains out as expressed to the letter finally I wish my Executors or administrators as the case may be

to pay all Just balances against me as soon as possible after they get the money in their hands with out making any sacrifice of property however to do so but not to take advantage of any of the delay of the law in paying my Just debts secondly I wish my dearly beloved Wife Louisa C. Providence to have and enjoy during her natural life the farm on which I now reside and its appurtenances embraced within the following bounds to wit beginning at the lower corner of the tract that Alfred H. Esterson Entered from the River with this ^{line to the} ~~line~~ ^{line} have thence down the hundred and twenty poles to the corner separating it from the tract of Land Entered below thence with that line to the River and from thence up the River to the place of beginning Also I Give and bequeath with my farm as above designated to my said beloved Wife Louisa C. Providence only during her widow hood all of the stock of provisions and Groceries on hand at the time of my death also the Groin of Every description ~~both~~ in the grounds and the growing crop the stock of Every kind and description with the Farming utensils Waggons plows and Every thing on the Farm will stand at said periods to gather with the following slaves to work the farm and to wait upon her to wit Jerry Jack Abner Abraham Siller & her child Ann and Sarah it to be distinctly understood that I Give and bequeath the farm during her life time and the stock Waggon utensils &c.

Enter during her widow hood with my Executor to take A part of the stock ready numerical with out price & that in case of my said dearly beloved Louisa C. Providence marrying require the said number of stock Waggons plows utensils to my estate to be disposed of for the benefit of my heirs and all if my said dear beloved Wife cannot agree with the said slaves or manager them and they should become refractory she in such case may apply to my Executor who shall hire them out as is usual to hire out slaves by publick advertisement and the proceeds of these hire shall go to my Estate it is to be understood only those are to be hired out that she may designate and apply to have hired out and in case of her marrying as aforesaid then all off the said slaves shall be hired out yearly by my said Executor and the proceeds disposed of as is here in after directed it is expected by me that by my liberal bequests and provisions for my wife that she will pay particular attention to my children and have them well Educated but if should get married again then I wish the hire of the slaves to go to their support and Education as far as it may be thought necessary until they Respectfully born of age Thirdly I wish my Executor to Rent out the Cherry the Horse house slave house and kitchen land to the best bidder for one or more years at his discretion taken Respectably security for the payment of the rents year by or half yearly and I wish my said Executor to rent out all my other farms to good & responsible farmers

who will keep them in good repair and pay the rent punctually and I wish all of said rents to be sold annually which rents from all acres to be loded out and interest for the benefit of my children Dorothy & Geo and bequeath to my children Mary Jane, John Joseph Nancy Angelina and William B. the following slaves in order that they are named to George J. Albert to John J. Sarah to Nancy A. George to William B. Myra or as she is commonly called pup for my wife to have the service and control of said slaves until each of my said children become of age Respectfully or unless they get married which if it takes place before that period they are to be considered of age and the slaves given to them accordingly also to give to each when they get married in addition one hundred or fifty dollars worth of property to set them up in housekeeping this property to be taken out of the stock or the increase of the stock on the future fifthly I give and do give with all the residue of my property of what kind soever it may be Lands townships notes bonds stock equities accounts or what evidence of debts it may be to my said children Mary J. John J. Nancy A. and William B. to be equally divided amongst them and as any of them be come of age or get married they are to receive he sides what is above specified their equal proportion of the interest of my money land or of rents or from the stock

or from what ever source it may accrue so that it may be received yearly and paid to them separate from the amount of the unmatured or matured interest I hereby appoint and constitute my executor James Caldwell my executor in lieu of the one with my wife Louisa E. Provider Executor to this my last will and codicil to be named hoping that they will accept of this trust and perform the same as I have no doubt they will Gladly and I wish it to be understood that I do not wish my wife to be accountable for the use of any of the provisions on the place or of the grain or crop or of the stock necessary for the support of the family and from now for my bequest or death in the stock only in case of her death or the death of her widow herds is any rather to be taken of it and there only to part in with my other estate and I desire that I wish in now case now or to have this will executed or broken or to have any part of my estate particularly my slaves or any parts of them sold under advice of chancery or order of any court in testimony where of I have here unto set my hand and affixed my seal at Clayton County this thirteenth day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty seven signed and sealed in the presence of J. W. Stephen W. Campbell Thomas M. Brinson B. W. Holman G. W. Martin

Whereas it has pleased almighty God in his infinite goodness to continue me here on till this date but with my amendment in my bodily health and wishing to confer my disposition of my property as stated in the above last will and testament and I am especially to declare my intention to give and bequeath to my beloved wife Louisa C. Brooker every thing as specified situated in my dwelling house as house hold and Kitchen furniture to include every thing as it will stand at my death and whereas my brother Laurus Brooker left me by his last will and testament a plantation situated in Row County and three negro slaves after the death of his wife or her marriage the condition of said bequest as more set forth in said will to which reference is given and now to dispose of the bequest of my brother to me I make this bequest or addition to my former former will made the twentieth day of April 1849 first after the death of my brother's widow or any circumstance that will give me the rule of said property I wish the said plantation to be offered to my brother Jeptha Brooker and my sister Jane Eldridge Nancy Brownson Judy Beatta Polly Jackson Elizabeth Worton or which every of them will take it and pay my Executors four thousand five hundred dollars and in default of none of them being willing to pay the same forth then my Executors to put it up at public sale to the best bidder and of the proceeds of said sale in either case to give to my said Brother and Sister as above named or their heirs the sum of two hundred dollars each except my Brownson and to her three hundred dollars

and of the negroes in said will as for said I wish my brother Laurus George Brownson to have five hundred by paying up said plantation for him to my Executors the other two negroes to be sold at public sale to the best bidder the avails of the plantation and negroes after paying the above legacy to be put in to my Estate to be equally divided amongst my heirs as is provided by my aforesaid will and testament and also all monies that may accrue to my Estate from my said brother's will after paying the legacy of seven hundred dollars to his widow-his wife after her death and the half of the slaves that she will have until then and from every sort according to its provision to be so divided. In testimony where of I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this the seventeenth day of May in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty nine I make the above bequest I have inadvertently omitted the name of my sister Channy Edgington and now wish her to be placed in all respects equal with Jane Eldridge in the legacy of two hundred dollars and the offer of the plantation as above shown.
