Secondly, I give and bequeath to my beloved daughter
Elizabeth Jane Cunningham formerly Elizabeth Jane Armstrong
One bedstead and furniture.

Thirdly, I give and bequeath the remainder of my
property both real and personal to my other eight
children (to wit) Martha, Martin Vanhook, Cynthia,
Parthena, William Clayton, James Milo, Sarah Cotton, Mary
Ellen. I direct that it shall be divided equally between
the said children above named. Both real & personal, except
William Clayton and James Milo, shall have all of the effects
arising from my father's estate and the other children is
to have no share in said estate. I direct that soon as
practicable after my death all my personal property shall be
sold on twelve months time. I direct after eight years from
the first of January 1859, and after that time I direct that my
executors advertise my land or lands and sell them to
the highest bidder on all them privately, if they may think
best or will be more advantage to the said children, or to
sell all or any of my personal property if in their judgment
they may think it best for said heirs. I also give my
Power to compromise all suits that may be brought against
my estate. Fourthly & Lastly, I do hereby nominate and
appoint George W. Goff & Williams & Russell my executors
