I William Gibbons of the County of Meigs and State of Tennessee being weak in body but of sound mind and disposing memory, and being desirous that the property of which I may die seized and possess both real and personal, shall be disposed of in such a manner as seems right and proper, do make and give public and declare this to be my last will and testament. In form following to wit:

1st I will and direct that all my just debts and funeral expenses be paid out of my estate.
