 other words more than compensate by their labour the trouble & expense of
 keeping them & supporting them a large number of accounts has been presented
 to us by Mr Cooper purporting to be truly furnished the children
 named in Walls Will by the adm^r & his wife; Upon this accounts & the
 dealings between the Adm^r & the said children the Committee do not believe them
 to be authorized by Order of Court to Report any thing and in fact the committee
 think they should be the subject of a different proceeding between parties
 Mr Cooper has made no distribution of said estate, nor has two years elapsed
 since administration granted Mr Cooper has also exhibited to us affidavits of
 a mode in which he has treated said children this is also a subject not within
 the scope of their authority to examine as the Committee think as if any
 complaint existed on that score they should be investigated in a different
 manner than by ex parte affidavits, or in an ex parte proceeding. The
 committee can say that the affidavits represented by Mr Cooper speak favour
 of his Conduct February 16th 1819
