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unassigned a part of a committee appointed by the County Court to settle William Cooper as Administrator with the will annexed of the estate of Mr. Wall deceased, upon examination of such Testimony as has been tendered to us by said Cooper & Report that said Wall did himself of a tract land containing about 389 acres, also ten Negroes and other personal property to the value of \$304. all of which has come into the hands and possession of said adm't that said Wall left no debts against him at his death or at least none has been shown or claimed to have been paid by said Administrator at the request of Mr. Cooper we also report that from the evidence presented to us concerning of expense affidavits, we do not suppose on the age & condition of said Negroes that they would meet any profit, on other words more than compensate by their labour the trouble & expense of keeping them & supporting them a large number of accounts has been presented to us by Mr. Cooper purporting to be entirely furnished the children mentioned in Walls Will by the adm't & his wife; Upon these accounts & the writings between the adm't & the said children the Committee do not believe them to be authorized by Order of Court to report anything and in fact the committee being they should be the subject of a different proceeding between parties & Cooper has made no distribution of said estate; nor has two years elapsed since administration granted Mr. Cooper has also exhibited to us affidavits of a mode in which he has treated several children this is also a subject not within the scope of their authority to examine as the Committee thing as if any complaint exist on that score they should be investigated in a different manner there by ex parte affidavits or in an ex rel proceeding. The Committee can say that the affidavits represented by Mr. Cooper speak favourably of his conduct February 15th 1819
