I Confirm the Gift of a Negro Girl named Maria to my beloved daughter Abigail

I Give & bequeath unto my beloved Daughter Martha a Negro Girl named  
Mary and Feather bed & one half I also confirm the Gift of one hundred and  
fifty acres of Land lying in Logan County Kentucky to my son James

I also confirm the Gift of two Hundred acres of Land lying in Logan  
County Ky to my Son John

I also have a Negro man named James to be sold at the direction of my Executors  
for the purpose of buying two negroes with the same money for the benefit of  
my beloved wife during her natural life

All the above property left to my beloved wife at her death to be sold and  
the money to be Equally divided amongst my children with the part  
that falls to my Daughter Sally to be Equally divided amongst  
the lawful together heirs of her body

I also request that the money due the State with my present  
taxes of Pollages and on this property which can be spared to be  
paid and the Money I owing therefrom to be put to the use of
