My will and Desire further is that my Old Negro Woman Tabby live with my wife and be maintained out of the estate I have Giving her my will further is that my Executors or Executrix qualify wth without Security to this Will

My will and Desire further is that my wife Sarah shall keep all my Stock of all kind with all my house hold & kitchen furniture for the space of Two years from my Deceased and at the expiration of that time my will is that it be Equally Divided with all the money after paying my Debt between my wife & all my children

And I do by these presents appoint my wife Sarah Shaw and my brother Thomas Shaw & Henry Williams Executors and Executrix to this my last will & Testament and do by these presents revoke and Disannul all others and constitute this my last will and Testament in Writings Wherof I do subscribe and seal this 27th day of August 1819
