Crockett has been duly Elected Constable in and for the County of Obion in Civil District No. 6 to serve to the End of Two years from & after the first Saturday in March last (1840) — Now if the Said Isaac H. Crockett, Shall well & truly faithfully perform all the duties of Constable as the law directs — pay over all moneys by him collected to the proper person or persons, & account for all property & effects that may come to his hands as the law directs during his Continuance in office then this obligation to be void else to remain in full force & virtue
