next county court where orders for administration
passed: and the same goods chattels and credits of the said
deceased at the time of his death or which at any time after
shall come to the hands or possession of the said Bird
& Foulus Administrators or into the hands or possession
of any other person or persons for them do well and truly
administer according to law, and further do make or
cause to be made a true and just account of their said
administration within 100 years after the date of these
presents and all the rest and the residue of said goods
chattels and credits which shall be found remaining after
the said administrators account the same being first
examined and allowed by the county court shall deliver
and pay unto such person or persons respectively as the
same shall be due unto pursuant to law, and if it
shall appear that any last will and testament was
made by the deceased and the executor or executors
therein named do exhibit the same unto Court making
request to have it allowed and approved accordingly if
the said Blackman H. Bird & Joseph A. Faulks above bound
being thereunto required do render and deliver the said

letters of administration (approbation of such testimony
being first had and made) in said court; then this
obligation to be void and of none effect or else to remain
in full force and virtue. Given under our hands
