which was proved in open court at August Session 1831 and was ordered
to be recorded and is in the words and figures following To wit

I Joseph Love of the county of Rhea and State of Tennessee being of sound
mind and disposing memory - Do make ordain publish and declare, this to
be my last Will and Testament - that is to say

First. I direct my just debts to be paid out of my estate -

Second. I give and bequeath absolutely in fee simple to my wife Mary E. Love
and her heirs forever, the house and lot, on which I now live, in what is
called the Southern Liberties of Washington, adjoining Shacks Alley
and opposite to the Sarsyard - And also the house and lot in Southern
Liberty, on which Samuel Tucker now lives lying immediately at the
head of the Spring - Also my negro woman Ann, my negro man
Nathan and my negro girl Harriet -

Third. I give and bequeath to my son William H. Love and his heirs
my Sarsyard lot and the lot adjoining thereto across the creek

in the Southern Liberties the stock of hides & leather on hand - a three
year old mare of a dun color and a saddle and bridle

Fourth. I give and bequeath to my sons Jacob H. Love and Joseph H.
Love and their heirs, my plantation of six hundred and forty acres
in Rhea county adjoining lands of Palatiah Christen, and being parcel
of the five thousand Acre Grant, called the Pleasant garden tract to
be equally divided between them - Provided however the rents
and profits of said tract of land, are to be used as a common fund
by my wife Mary E. Love for the support of her family, including
all her household - until my son Joseph H. Love, shall arrive to the
age of twenty one years - To effect which purpose my wife Mary
E. Love shall have the sole power of renting or leasing the said tract
of land or working the same for the period aforesaid. My son Joseph is
also to have at the age of twenty one, a horse saddle and bridle to be
worth one hundred dollars to be paid by my executors -

Fifth. I give and bequeath to my daughter Rebecca A. and her
heirs, my negro girl Betty and negro boy Gibson. Also a horse saddle
& bridle, to be worth one hundred dollars, to be paid by my Executors,
when she marries or arrives at the age of twenty one -

Sixth. I will and direct my Executors to give to my sons, William H.
Jacob H. & Joseph H. and my daughter Rebecca A. each a good feather
bed, and well furnished with bed clothing.

Seventh. I will and direct my Executors to sell and convey to the
purchasers thereof my lands in Knox & Anderson Counties - upon as
advantageous terms as they can; the purchase money whereof together with
the debts now due me are to be appropriated to the payments of my
debts - And the balance if any is to be vested in my wife Mary E. Love
for the support of my family -

Eighth. I will give and bequeath to my wife Mary E. Love, my
negroes Chancy Jack, Milly, Willett, Big Eliza, Little Eliza, Alexander,
Philip, Rachel, Allen and Sam - during her life or widow hood & after
death or intermarriage terminates this estate in my wife Mary E. Love
And upon the happening of either of events the said negroes or their value
are to be equally divided amongst and between my children, Jefferson
B. Love, Samuel Monroe Love, William H. Love, Margaret Shellen and

Harry Love, Joseph N. Love and Rebecca Ann Love, or the heirs of their bodies— Provided however my wife Mary E. Love is hereby vested with full power to give to any or either of my aforesaid children their or either of their share or shares, of said negroes at any time she may think proper. And provided further, should my lands in Knox and Anderson Counties and such debts as are due my estate, be insufficient to pay my debts and specified legacies herein bequeathed, then each and every of the aforesaid negroes are to stand chargeable with the payment of my debts and specified legacies— and the balance thereof to be divided amongst my aforesaid children, at the times and in the manner, herein before pointed out and directed, in reference to the whole of said negroes— And provided further the aforesaid negroes Chaney, Jack, Milley, Villet, Big Eliza, Little Eliza, Alexander, Philip, Rachel, Allen & Sam are to stand chargeable with the sum of five hundred dollars, which I will and bequeath to my daughter Rebecca to be paid to her by my Executors, when she shall arrive at the age of twenty one years or marry—

Ninth. I give and bequeath to my wife Mary E. Love my waggons, horses, cattle, hogs, sheep, household and kitchen furniture and farming utensils and oxen and library—

Tenth. I give & bequeath to my son Joseph my silver watch— and my clock to my daughter Rebecca—

Lastly I appoint my wife Mary E. Love, my son Jefferson B. Love and my friend & brother in law Thomas Bell of Knox County my Executors & Executors of this my last will and Testament—
