The Last Will & Testament of James Rogers dec^d
Which was returned to court at November Sessions 1834 and was
duly proved and ordered to be recorded and is as follows to wit

In the name of God Amen I James Rogers of the County of Blount
and State of Tennessee being weak in body though sound in mind &
memory knowing the uncertainty of life and the certainty of death and
that it is appointed for all men once to die do make and ordain
this my last Will and Testament Namely first I give and
bequeath my soul to God that gave it and my body to the dust
to be buried in a decent christian like manner at the discretion
of my Executors nothing doubting but that I shall receive the
same again at the great resurrection and with respect to such
earthly treasure as God has blessed me with First I give and
mise bequeath and dispose of it in the following manner
and form First I give to my beloved wife Anna Rogers one third
of all the moveable property during the time of her remaining
my widow or untill her death with the exception that my
oldest daughter ^{Mary Rogers} ~~Eliza Rogers~~ is first to have a equal portion
with the two daughters that is married to be in the same like
property that they received when married and the balance of the
moveable property to be equally divided between all my children
and as to my land property First my will is that my son John
Rogers have the tract of land whereon he now lives containing eighty
acres and as for my son William Rogers I have heretofore given
him his portion of my land estate on Penny by deed of conveyance
containing two hundred acres I also give and bequeath my son
James Rogers the tract of land whereon he now lives on Penny
containing one hundred acres Also the tract of land whereon I
now live containing four hundred and forty three acres and a half
four hundred acres of said tract to be divided between my four
daughters Mary Elizabeth, Margaret & Anne Rogers agreeable to
quantity and quality so as to make each ones number of acres of
equal value to be so divided as to leave the forty three and a half
acres to include the Mills Cotton gin and the seat thereof and to
include my dwelling house and garden adjoining the house

It is further my will and desire that the profits arising from the
Mills and Cotton Gin be equally divided every year between all my
children after reserving to my wife a plentiful and lawful decent
support during her lifetime or widowhood and at ^{her} death all she
leaves to be equally divided between all my children It is further
my will that all my slaves be and remain in the possession of my
wife during her lifetime or widowhood and then to be sold to the
highest bidder and the money equally divided between all my
children further it is my will that the forty three and a half acres
which includes the Mills shall be sold to the highest bidder and
the money equally divided between all my children at my
wifes death It is my will that my heirs shall continue to dig or
bore for salt water in Blount County & State of Tennessee as far
as one hundred feet at a joint expence and if they succeed in
getting salt water in that distance the profits arising therefrom
to be divided equally between all my heirs and if after they dig
or bore the one hundred feet if any of the heirs fails or refuses
to pay their equal part of the expences of digging or boring they
thereby forfeit all claim to the profits that ever may arise to such of the
heirs as may succeed in procuring salt water and lastly I do hereby
appoint my son John Rogers sole Executor of this my last Will and
Testament hereby revoking all former wills by me made In witness
whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 2nd day of
October 1834 signed sealed published and declared by the above named
James Rogers to be his last Will & Testament in the presents of us
who have hereunto subscribed our names as witnesses in the presents
of the Testator.

I Robert Bell of the County of Ohio in the State of Tennessee, well knowing the uncertainty of human life - and being of sound mind and disposing memory and being desirous that the property both real and personal of which I may die seized shall at my death be disposed of in such manner as my own conscience and sense of propriety may dictate. Do make ordain publish and declare this as my last will and testament - that is to say. After the payment of my just debts (which are but few) and funeral expenses - I will and direct that my Executors hereinafter named shall in due time collect all debts due or to become due my estate & moreover my said Executors shall sell at public sale to the highest bidder, either for prompt payment or upon such credit, not exceeding twelve months as they see their discretion may think best, my lands

survivors of them - to-wit. Lucy a woman aged about fifty years, Elijah a man aged about forty five years, black Jack a man aged about thirty years, yellow Jack a man aged about twenty seven years, Harry a man aged about twenty five years, Alexander a man aged about twenty three years and Ned a man aged about nineteen years - And to make titles therefor to the purchaser or purchasers - Also at the same time and in the same manner to sell all my stock of every description, household and kitchen furniture, farming utensils ferry boat and Periqua, excepted such special legacies as I may herein otherwise direct and dispose of - And the money arising from such sale or sales and all debts due or to become due my estate, (except as I may herein differently direct) upon coming into the hands of my Executors shall be paid by them in equal shares to my sister Elizabeth Shum, wife of Henry Shum of Roane County Tennessee, my niece Nancy Carmichael of Knox County Tennessee, my niece Elizabeth Copeland of Knox County Tennessee, my niece Mary Thomas wife of Knox County Tennessee, my niece Rebecca daughter of my sister Sarah Gibbons of Hawkins County Tennessee daughter of my niece Elizabeth Larkins of Hawkins County Tennessee daughter of my sister Sarah Gibbons, my niece Mary Gibbons of Hawkins County Tennessee daughter of my sister Sarah Gibbons and my niece Rebecca Mary daughter of my sister Sarah Gibbons and my niece Rebecca Mary daughter of my brother William Bell deceased - to whom and to each of whom in equal shares I hereby will and bequeath the money aforesaid and to their heirs respectively forever - I will and bequeath to my three nephews William Gibbons, James Gibbons and Robert Gibbons sons of my sister Sarah Gibbons of the County of Hawkins in the State of Tennessee and to their heirs in per diem forever all my lands lying on the south side of Tennessee River in Ohio County Tennessee District & State of Tennessee, containing about four hundred acres, being of different fractions but all adjoining each other - to-wit. one hundred & sixteen & a half acres situate in the 5th range west of the meridian first fractional township 25th section and the north west quarter of said section - One hundred and twenty three acres situate in the 5th range west of the meridian first fractional township 24th section and the south west fractional quarter of said section - Twenty two & a half acres situate in the 5th range west of the meridian first fractional township 24th section

and the North west fractional quarter of said section - Fifty acres situate in the 5th range west of the meridian first fractional township 24th section and the North east fractional quarter of said section - One hundred and twenty three acres situate in the 5th range west of the meridian, first fractional township 24th section and the south west quarter of said section - 3rd Whereas my slave Sophia on or about the the month of October 1832. contracted for her freedom and that of her children, to wit, Mary aged eight years, Sam aged five years, Granville aged four years, and Claiborne aged two years - And whether the said Sophia has in good faith fulfilled the said contract on her part, the services and consideration money for which, is hereby acknowledged to be received. I do by these presents manumit discharge and forever set free at my death the said Sophia and her aforesaid children Mary, Sam, Granville and Claiborne - And do well and direct that my Executors after my death shall proceed as the laws of the State of Tennessee in that behalf provide to petition the County Court of Rhea or such other court or jurisdiction as may be prescribed by the Statutes of said State for the fulfillment and execution of my will in the emancipation of the said Sophia & her children Mary, Sam, Granville & Claiborne - And for the comfortable maintainance of the said Sophia, and to prevent any difficulty in the procurement of security, that the said Sophia shall not become a county charge I hereby will and bequeath to my friend Isaac Benson of the County Rhea & State of Tennessee in whom I have entire confidence my tract of land on the North bank of Tennessee River adjoining the Hissam Harrison tract above containing fifty acres Beginning at a Sycamore tree on the North bank of Tennessee river Charles McClung's upper corner of a fifteen hundred acre tract and running with the upper line thereof west one hundred and twenty poles to a stake thence east to the river thence down the meanders of the same to the beginning being the fifty acre tract of land conveyed by Josiah Danforth to Thomas H. Clark by deed bearing date the 25th day of July 1810. and registered in Rhea county the 26th day of March 1813. in trust that the proceeds rents and profit thereof shall go to the entire use and benefit of the said Sophia during her life - And at her death the said

trust shall terminate and upon that event happening I hereby will and bequeath the said tract of land to my Nephew Thomas Bell of Rhea County Tennessee and his heirs in fee simple forever - I further direct that my Executors return & set apart two hundred dollars out of the proceeds of the sales of my slaves & other property or out of said debts as may be owing to me at the time of my death or to become due there after and pay the same in six annual instalments of thirty three and a third dollars each to the said Sophia for her own use - I further give and bequeath to the said Sophia one Cow and calf and one feather bed and furniture out of my estate to be selected by my Executors - 4th For good and sufficient reasons, or at least such as satisfying my own conscience, I give and bequeath to my aforesaid friend Isaac Benson the tract of land on which I now live lying on the North bank of Tennessee River, and below the mouth of and adjoining Richland Creek containing one hundred and forty acres and being parcel of a tract of one hundred and ninety acres conveyed to me by Thomas H. Clark of Roane County by deed bearing date the 16th day of September 1816 and Registered in Rhea county the 7th day of December 1816 in trust that the proceeds thereof shall go to the use and benefit of Mary eldest child of Sophia out of the rents and profits of which the said Trustee is to raise and maintain the said Mary & for whom I hereby appoint him Guardian, to keep her decently clothed and have her educated, as far in english literature as shall be prescribed by my Executors in writing from under their hands and seals or the survivors of them - & registered in the registers office of the county of Rhea - Provided however the trust hereby last created shall terminate on the first day of January 1854. And the said tract of land thereupon become the property in fee simple of the said Mary, and her heirs forever - 5th I will and direct that Sam, Granville and Claiborne the three sons of Sophia herein emancipated shall be by my Executors bound or apprenticed to fit and proper persons to learn useful and honorable mechanical trades in such manner for such time and upon such terms as my said Executors for them and each of them and on their part may promise and undertake - 6th I nominate, constitute and appoint John Locke and Thomas
