kitchen furniture of every kind also my stock of live & off
every sort also my negroes with slave and his wife
and her child Alexander also Jack and Ester = I leave
unto my daughter Margaret Ridgely exclusive of what I have
heretofore given her my negroes Jane and his wife Mink
I leave unto my son John James Stockton exclusive of what I
heretofore given him one half of two fractional quarters of
land that he now lives on except some ten or twelve acres
forming a fraction of more adjoining the River near my
Glands. The other half of the fractions that the said
Stockton lives on I leave unto my daughter Mary Stockton
Deceased four children my wife Williams Matilda
Preston and Reuben = I leave unto my son Preston
exclusive of what I have heretofore given him one feather
Bed and Furniture also my Island in the Tennessee River
and the three and four acres on the south side of the River
and the ten or twelve acres that I have & would out of the
fraction forming it I also give him my negro boy
Hansel = I leave unto my son John one feather bed
and furniture also one half of my tract of Land
on New Market, Tenn. The tract containing two hundred
& twenty six acres by my son John discounting
something like three hundred dollars that he paid
to work the payment of that Land I also give unto
my son John one negro boy named Ben = I give
unto my son William one feather Bed and
furniture and negro boy named Isaac and after
the death of my wife I give to him the plantation

on which I now live and the furniture that belongs to the House say the wooden furniture. I leave my sons Reator and John my Executors and after the death of my Wife my desire is that all the property that remains on hand that I have left her shall be sold divided equally amongst my children to wit George Nicols John William Sam Sarah M Woods & Janey P Stockton decess four children my desire is that the property should not be sold but divided equally amongst the above named where I have said Sam above I meant Sam Jackson Margaret Rodden will be understood not to have any part of this division as I think what I have left her sufficient at first. If John Jackson should make any attempt to defeat this my last will and desire pay him one dollar and let it be his wife's portion of my estate. The portion that will be coming to my grand children Stocktons that my Executors keep it in their ^{own} hands until they become of age or marry by paying interest on the money my old negro woman Sam at the death of my Wife I wish to be free and I engage it on my Executors not to let her become a County Charge nor suffer for the necessaries of life. I have made this my last will and Testament Divine Godly and deliberately hereunto with my own hand and hope it will give general satisfaction but its hard to do of things of this nature done at home 4th Nov 1839
