I also will to my son Thomas & my Clerk every ^{thing} contained in my will of the 14th day of September 1839 which will is witnessed by Andrew McCalib & James Smith I wish to stand as it now does as it is not my wish to alter it any further than is contained in this bequest made this 15th day of October 1840

Those of my heirs falling in debt to each other as mentioned in the 15 clause or below of my will of the 14th of September 1839 I wish so attend as to give the one falling in debt instead of two years only I would wish the payment made in equal instalments in two three four & five years after my decease. This I wish not to interfere with my will of the 14th Septem 1839 Only ^{to} as is particularly stated.

The last will and Testament of James Preston deceased was proven in a law court at November Session 1840 and was ordered to be read and is as follows (to wit)

James Preston last will and desire all my just debts to be paid I leave unto my wife Charlotte during her natural life The plantation on which I now live with all my farming tools of every description with all my household and kitchen furniture of every kind also my stock of beasts of every sort also my negroes with slave and his wife and his child Abner also Jack and Ester I leave unto my daughter Margaret Riddle exclusive of what I have heretofore given her my Negroes Isaac and his wife Merit I leave unto my son John James Stockton exclusive of what I heretofore given him one sixth of two hundred quarters of land that he now lives on except some ten or twelve acres ^{there are} joining a fraction of more adjoining the River near my Islands The other three fourths of the fractions that the said Stockton lives on I leave unto my daughter Mary Stockton Deceased four children viz viz William Mandar Preston and Reuben I leave unto my son Reuben exclusive of what I have heretofore given him one feather Bed and Furniture also my Island in the Tennessee River and the three acres parcel on the south side of the River and the ten or twelve acres that I have & would out of the fraction joining it I also give him my negro boy Hancock I leave unto my son John one feather bed and furniture also one half of my tract of Land on Snows Mountain the tract containing two hundred & twenty six acres by my son John discounting something like three hundred dollars that he paid to work the payment of that Land I also give unto my son John one negro boy named Ben I give unto my son William one feather Bed and furniture and negro boy named Isaac and after the death of my wife I give to him the plantation

on which I now live and the furniture that belongs
 to the House say the wooden furniture. I leave
 my sons Reator and John my Executors and after the
 death of my Wife my desire is that all the property that
 remains on hand that I have left her shall be sold
 divided equally amongst my children to wit
 George Nicols John William Sam Sarah M Woods &
 Nancy P Stockton decess four children my desire
 is that the property should not be sold but
 divided equally amongst the above named whom
 I have said Sam above I meant Sam Jackson
 Margaret Rodden will be understood not to have
 any part of this division as I think what I have
 left her sufficient at first If John Jackson
 should make any attempt to defeat this my
 last will and desire pay him one dollar and
 let it be his wife's portion of my estate The
 portion that will be coming to my grand Children
 Stocktons that my Executors keep it in their ^{own} hands
 until they become of age or marry by paying Interest
 on the money my old negro woman Sam at the
 death of my Wife I wish to be free and I enjoin
 it on my Executors not to let her become a County
 Charge nor suffer for the necessaries of life

I have made this my last will and Testament
 with coolly and deliberation here wrote with my
 own hand and hope it shall give general
 satisfaction but its hard to do of things of
