Considering the uncertainty of this mortal life and being weak in body but of sound mind and disposing memory, do hereby make, ordain, constitute and appoint and by these presents have made ordained constituted and appointed these to be my last Will and Testament in the manner and form following. That is, to say - as I have always had reasons to be pleased with my dearest wife Polly I retain for her to my last moments the most tender sentiments I breathe her to watch in order to preserve our children from the dangers which incursions their infancy and my wish and desire is that my said wife Polly continue to live and reside on my possessions in the town of Washington in charge of our said family counselling directing and governing them as heretofore and for her and their future comfort and convenience my will and desire is that my executors proceed to have my brick house finished in a workman like manner by plastering and painting the same and to procure a convenient brick smoke house built in front of the east door and at the distance of twelve feet from said house to be fourteen by twenty fifteen feet high with a chimney in one end and a private or necessary house in the lower end of my garden twelve feet square with a partition through the center and proceed to purchase for the use of my said family while they continue together two Chaise presses one of Cherry the other of pine, two side boards of Cherry the price not to exceed thirty dollars, ten Cherry beadsteads made after the newest fashion and ten feather beds and furniture together with a convenient number of fire dogs to use in the new house when finished where as long as my family continues to reside all my personal property is to be and remain as common stock for their use and benefit - Further my wish and desire is that after my decease my executors proceed as opportunity may offer to purchase land for the benefit of my heirs to be paid for with the disposable funds I now have in hand together with my debts as collected and my negroes now in my possession except my negro boy Jack which said negro boy Jack I give and bequeath to my much beloved and dutiful daughter Hannah Leuty, This I leave hereby to be purchased my will is that it be within the county of Rhea and to such person or persons as my executors are hereby requested and directed

to as soon as may be after my decease to put all my debts on a train of legal collection if not promptly paid. Further my will is that as my right full heirs shall arrive at full age and call for the same they are to have of all my estate of personal, herein intended as common stock that may be then on hand as well my real estate, as well that now purchased as that hereby directed to be purchased an equal dividend of these and there alike in manner and form as the statutes in such case provides - and untill the time my youngest child comes of age my land or so much thereof as may not be apportioned of as to be leased out the proceeds whereof is to be a counted common stock applied to supporting the family and schooling my children - Lastly my desire and will is that Palatiah Chilton Thomas Ready and John Locke be appointed my Executors to this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking all others either written or nuncupative Will or Wills declaring this to be my only and true last Will and Testament whereunto with my own hand I have wrote my name and affixed my seal this twenty second day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty nine A.
