The Last Will and Testament of Samuel Robinson deceased

I Samuel Robinson of the County of Shenandoah and State of Virginia being weak of body but of sound mind and disposing memory, and being desirous that my property should be disposed of after my death, in such way and manner as to me at least appears to be right, do hereby make for and do hereby declare this to be my last will and testament in regard thereto to wit

I will and bequeath that my funeral expenses be first paid together with any just debts which as of or in any, out of any money, or effects, which I may die seized or possessed of.  
 I further will and bequeath to my beloved wife Mary Robinson and my children Franklin Robinson, Charles Robinson, James L. Robinson and Mary C. Robinson all the lands and personal property that I may die seized and possessed of as common stock, the proceeds thereof to be managed and controlled by my said wife and eldest son, to be applied as far as necessary to the maintenance of my wife and children with the education of said children for and during the natural life of my said wife leaving at entirely with her, that however and that my said children should marry, to give said child such portion of said common stock which may then be on hand, as she may claim, right and proper due regard being had by her, to an equitable division of said common stock

I further will and direct that after my death there be no public sale of my personal property and effects, or any part thereof and no inventory thereof made and returned to the County Court, or any public administration thereof thereon under the supervision of the County Court, leaving the whole to be controlled by my said wife as she may deem most advisable for the advancement of the interest of her and my said children
