SIXTH — I further will & direct that all my personal estate consisting of Notes, accounts, chases in action, & monies, after the payment of debts & legacies shall be equally divided, Shared & Share alike between my said wife Rebecca Hoyal my daughter Catherine Pyott, wife of John E. Pyott and my two sons John Hoyal Jr & James Hoyal. And that my Executors shall be authorized to pay to my wife Rebecca Hoyal and to my daughter Catherine Pyott at any time after my death, their share in said personal estate of course, taking the receipt of each for the same, which shall be a sufficient voucher to said Executors for the same in any settlement they may have to make, said Executors are to reserve out of my wife's & daughter's share in said property a sufficiency to meet their part of any possible claims against my estate, for three years, at the expiration of which time, the same, if not appropriated to the payment of debts, shall be paid to them, and their receipts then taken in full for their distribution share of said personal estate, which shall be proper vouchers for said Executors. The balance of said personal estate aforesaid shall be kept on interest for three years after my death & shall then be paid over to my two Sons John Hoyal Jr & James Hoyal if of age & if not of age to their guardian or guardians.

SEVENTH — It is my wish & desire & I hereby direct that my aforesaid daughter Catherine Pyott & her husband John E. Pyott, have the entire contrall and management of the renting and rents of the farm purchased by one in Hamilton County Tennessee known as the Dossell farm, until the final partition & division of the lands belonging to my said estate, they being accountable for & chargable with the acc't proceeds of said rents accruing after my death (but not to be charged with any rents accruing from said place before my death, & receiving the same in payment of yearly services rendered me) in the yearly acc'ts of the rents of the lands belonging to my estate, hereafter directed & provided for.

EIGHTH — I further will & bequeath to my wife Rebecca Hoyal a tract of the following tracts of land, to wit: One tract of land lying in the 7th civil district of Rhea County Tennessee on the North bank of Tennessee river & lying above the mouth of Richland Creek, adjoining the lands of James Polk & others. One tract of land lying on the 1st civil district of Meigs County Tennessee on some land, formerly owned by John Small, adjoining the lands of Foster and others. Also a tract of land lying in the civil district of Meigs County Tennessee on the South side of Tennessee River, known as the old Chatlin farm, adjoining the lands of Foster and others.

I have willed the above described tract of land to my wife as Trustee for the benefit of my two minor sons John Royal & James Royal who being of tender years & inexperienced in life I am desirous of providing a certain support for, during the whole of their lives against the many contingencies, uncertainties & misfortunes of life - It is my will & desire that my said wife as Trustee aforesaid shall have the absolute controller & management of said lands aforesaid, and that neither said lands or the proceeds of the same, shall be liable for the debts contracts & liabilities of my two sons aforesaid, it is my will & I do direct that my son John Royal Jr. shall during his life have the yearly net proceeds arising from the aforesaid farm in Rhea County & the aforesaid Survey farm in Meigs County Tenn. And that my son James Royal shall have the yearly net proceeds arising from the Old Chatter Farm in Meigs County. I direct that my said Trustee after paying taxes, repairs, improvements & all necessary expenses incident to said lands shall pay over the net proceeds of said lands to my said sons, so hereafter directed after they are at age, yearly, taking their receipt for the same. That said Trustee shall keep the proceeds of said rents, on interest, until either son of mine attains to the same shall come of age & then pay over & take his receipt for the same; that neither of my sons aforesaid shall have the power to dispose of the rents of said lands in advance of the payment to them of the same, & said Trustee is directed to make said payments annually & to my sons in person; and not to any other one for them, in the event of the death of either of my sons aforesaid the trust estate, as to the lands set apart for his benefit shall cease, as to him & the lands shall descend unencumbered to his legal heirs. Should my wife fail to act as Trustee aforesaid or die, then the Clerks of Court only, shall be authorized, to appoint a Trustee to carry out my special trust aforesaid.

NINTHLY

I further will & direct that none of the real estate of which I may die seized & possessed, or which may hereafter be purchased by my said Executrix, shall be partitioned or divided out amongst my children, until after the expiration of three years after my death, but I hereby will & direct that all my said lands except the farm hereinbefore bequeathed to my son John Jr. for a homestead during her natural life, & the Rhea County farm known before otherwise disposed of the Richland farm in Rhea County & Survey farm in Meigs County, herefore given to my wife Rebecca in trust for John Royal Jr. & the Chatter farm in Meigs County, herefore given to my wife in trust for my son James Royal to hold as a minor therefrom during the aforesaid period of three years, all of which is to be rented out yearly in the same, as may appear most advantageous & profitable, & the net proceeds of said rents for paying the taxes & expenses of all necessary repairs, and

other incidental expences, to be equally divided yearly, share & share alike, between my aforesaid wife Rebecca Royal, and my three children the said Catherine Pyott, John Royal Jr. & the said James Royal, charging my said daughter Catherine with the net proceeds of the rents of the Rhea County farm aforesaid, according after any death, and charging John Royal Jr. with the net proceeds of the Richland & Survey farm aforesaid, & charging James Royal with the net proceeds of the Old Chatter Farm in Meigs County. And after the expiration of the term of three years aforesaid, I will & direct that my wife the said Rebecca Royal, for herself, & assisted & counseled by my said Executor S. J. A. Frazier, and the said John C. Pyott & wife Catherine Pyott, together with my two friends Joseph S. Evans & Joseph D. Peter, acting for and representing my two minor sons, John & James Royal, but if they should be of full age, acting for & representing themselves, shall proceed to partition all the lands belonging to my said estate, giving my said wife said wife a child's part, or one fourth of all my said lands according to quantity & quality, including the aforesaid H. G. Clark farm, which she is to hold & use during her natural life, as donee in my landed estate and that they shall further partition & divide among all my aforesaid children, share & share alike, all the lands belonging to my said estate, subject to the donee interest of my wife as aforesaid - And I do further will & direct, that in said partition & division of said lands, that the farm lying above the mouth of Richland Creek in the civil district of Rhea County, on North side of Tennessee River, and the Survey Farm, lying on Survey Creek in Meigs County, herefore given to a Trustee for the benefit of John Royal Jr., shall be estimated in said partition, at their true value as a part of the share of John Royal Jr. in said estate, And that the old Chatter farm, lying on the South bank of Tennessee River, in Meigs County, shall be estimated & counted, in said partition, as a part of the share of James Royal in said estate - it is my intention in the above partition & division that my three children shall share equally, share & share alike, due regard being had to any advances, and said partition when made, is to be reduced to writing & signed by the aforesaid parties, and acknowledged & registered, as evidence of title to each of my devices in lawfully.

TENTHLY

Having during a long practice & labors as a Physician in the County of Rhea, received the patronage and friendship alike of the citizens of said County, and members of the Presbyterian and of the Cumberland, Methodist & Baptist Churches, and being desirous as well as feeling it my duty to contribute something more to aid in the advancement of the cause of Christianity, and thereby the correction of the morals of that portion of the Society, in which I expect my wife & little family to be left, & my sons reared & their characters formed - I therefore hereby will and bequeath to the Society known as the First Presbyterian Church at Washington Rhea County Tennessee, the sum of Four hundred dollars To be held & paid out

Church at Washington in said County, the sum of Two hundred Dollars - To the Baptist Church at Washington in said County the sum of Two hundred Dollars, - To the Methodist Episcopal Church South the sum of Two hundred Dollars - And Several sums for the purpose aforesaid, are by my said Executors to be paid over to such person or persons, as may be authorized and empowered by said Churches to receive the same out of any moneys belonging to my said Estate, at such time as my said Executors, in the exercise of a sound discretion, may consider best for all concerned, having in view the interests of my wife & children, as well as the aforesaid Churches.

ELEVENTH - Having during a long professional practice in the County of Rhea and adjoining Counties, created & have due one or considerable outstanding indebtedness, consisting of Notes and unexecuted accounts, and other evidences of indebtedness, the settlement of which has been postponed, suspended and delayed by the late war, and the confusion incident thereto, & my bad state of health until the collection & settlement thereof may have become impracticable & difficult in regard to lapse of time, & other questions incidental & growing out of said war, in view of all which I hereby give & direct my Executors hereafter appointed, with full plenary power and authority in the settlement & collection & adjustment of said debts, to exercise their sound discretion as to the time & mode of collecting the same, and in regard thereto, if they in the exercise of a sound discretion, may deem it more advantageous & more practicable as to the interests of my said estate, they will make all necessary compromises & agreements in regard to my debts & the collection thereof and all necessary purchases & sales of personal property & land as they may deem necessary to enable them to succeed in the collection of any & all of my outstanding debts of every kind due me - both old and new.

TWELFTH - It is my will & desire & I hereby request my Executors to assist my wife in the management of her estate & in the education of her two sons - And I hereby authorize my said Executors to give to my two minor sons, such sums out of their share of this estate before they arrive at age as they, together with my wife, may think proper right, and their receipt for the same shall be a sufficient voucher for said Executors.

THIRTEENTH - I further will & direct that all that share or portion of any and all lands by me in anywise bequeathed to my beloved daughter Catherine Pyott, is to be held by her in trust, for and during her natural life, for the following uses & trusts - That is to say, that the said Catherine Pyott have the possession & occupation of said lands & the benefit of the use of the rents & profits of said lands for & during her natural life, for the purpose of supporting & maintaining herself, her husband & her family, free from & without subject to a liability for debts

or contracts of her husband John Pyott, which said lands are to be supervised & controlled by the said John Pyott as Trustee, or by such other person as my said daughter Catherine Pyott, may at any time during her natural life choose or select (in writing under her hand & seal to be filed with my Executors) as Trustee for the purpose of taking charge of said land for the uses & trusts hereinabove stated, & at the death of my said daughter Catherine Pyott, the title to the remainder in said lands to rest in fee simple in her children or their issue, if any of them survive her before her death, such issue taking the share of the parent, that is such as the parent would have taken, had he or she survived; And in default of such children of my said daughter, or the issue of such children, the remainder in said lands upon her death will rest in her brothers the said John Foyal Jr & James Foyal in fee simple, & in this case if they should not survive her, such issue taking the part the Parent would have taken had he survived.

I further authorize & empower my said Executors, to purchase lands whenever they may deem it to the best interest of my estate to do so.

I do hereby nominate, constitute & appoint John E Pyott & S J A Frazer Executors of this my last will & Testament, hereby revoking all former wills or codicils by me at any time heretofore made & declaring this to be my only true last will & Testament -
