A paper purporting to be the Last Will & Testament of Joseph Looney was produced in open Court and being duly proved by the Oaths of Uriah Allison and Jacob Wren Subscribing Witnesses thereto was admitted to Record and on the Motion of Joseph Looney the Executor therein named who qualified as the same directs It is Ordered that Letters Testamentary do issue to him in due form

Which said will is in the words and figures following to wit
I Joseph Looney Senior of the County of Roane and State of Tennessee in the name of God am an Praise and ordain this My Last Will and Testament Here by revoking and Disannulling all other Wills by me heretofore made First I recommend my soul to God who gave it and my Body to its Mother Dust to be decently Buried by my surviving friends and Relations as to my worldly estate I Give and Bequeath it as follows. First I Give and bequeath to my Daughter Elizabeth Mansfield one Dollar to be paid by me Executor with in Six Months after my Decease To my Daughter Jane Bogard I Give and bequeath my Negro Woman Venus to said Jane Bogard and her forever also I Give and be quath to my Daughter Jane Bogard her natural Lifetime then to be Cared by Betty Bogard the eldest Daughter that Jane Bogard had by Abraham Bogard and my wife and child to a certain piece or quantity of land purchased by me from James Preston and Abner Preston

the Heirs of George Preston Deceat being apart of the same tract of land where an Abraham Bogard now lives Thirdly I Give and bequath to my sons Joseph Looney and his Heirs for ever my Negro Woman Cate with all the Ballances of my estate that I may Die paid of. Lastly I do hereby nominate and appoint my son Joseph Looney Executor of this my last Will and Testament signed and sealed this 5th day of November 1816 in the presents of Uriah Allison Jacob Wren Joseph Looney

A paper purporting to be the Last Will and testament of John Browder Deceased was produced in Court and being proved by the Oath of Washington Worwood and John Winters two of the Subscribing Witnesses thereto the same is admitted to Record and on the Motion of William B. Gentry one of the Executors therein named who made oath It is Ordered that Letters Testamentary issue to him in due form Reserving a right to the other Executors to qualify hereafter

Which said Will is in the words and figures following to wit

In the name of God I John Browder of Roane County and State of Tennessee being in perfect ^{mind} and memory do make and ordain this my Last will and Testament in manner and form following. First I give to my loving wife Fanny Browder during her life or widowhood the use of my plantation whereon I now live or untill my son Daniel Browder become of age at which time he is to have one ^{and when my son Daniel becomes of age he is to have one fourth part of said land as hereafter mentioned} fourth part of said land as hereafter mentioned I also bequeath to my wife during her life or widowhood good negro woman Sarah and her oldest and youngest child Jesse and Abraham Kipp & Sally and Pat Salsogine and Bequeath to my wife all my household and Kitchen furniture to be disposed of at her death as she may think proper

- Item I give and Bequeath to my daughter Jincy Eldredge one negroe girl about ten or Twelve years of age so soon as she can be conveniently purchased to gether with one Horse and other property to the amount of one hundred and Fifty Seven dollars Heretofore given me
- Item I give and Bequeath to my son James Browder when he arrives to the age of Twenty one years one fourth part of my Tract of Land whereon I now live not to include the mansion House also negroe boy Joshua To him and his heirs forever having already given him my Purman's Horse year old filly and one sow and pigs
- Item I give and Bequeath to my son James Browder when he arrives to the age of Twenty one years one fourth part of my tract of Land whereon I now live not to include the mansion House also negroe boy Jack to him and his heirs forever having already given him my clam Mars one year old filly and one sow and pigs
- Item I give and Bequeath my Saws and Blacksmiths Tools to my three sons
- Item I give and Bequeath to my son Jephtha Browder my tract of Land lying in the forks of Holston and Tennessee since negroe boy Abel and a tolerable good horse when he arrives at the age of Twenty one years Until that period arrives It is my will and desire that the said Land be rented out and the rent or profits arising therefrom (after paying the State the instalments which are or may become due for said land) be equally divided between all my daughters
- Item I give and bequeath to each of my daughters Mary Judah Polly Fanny Elizabeth after they have come of age one share and when requested one negroe To wit the eldest of said daughters to have the eldest negroe not otherwise disposed of and so on down to the youngest
- Item In case I should finally hold my land on the North side of Clinch after all debts are ended It is my will that my Executors sell the same at their discretion and divide the

- money arising therefrom equally among or between all my daughters
- Item It is my will and desire that my Executors sell a sufficient quantity of my property to pay off and discharge all the debts that may be due or owing by me as well as to make up whatever deficiency there may be in paying for a negroe girl for my daughter Jincy Eldredge as mentioned in the second Section
- Item Should any of my Children previous to their Marriage choose to remain with their mother then and in that case they shall be entitled to so much of the produce or profits arising from the Land and negroe left to my wife as will together with the property given them be sufficient for their Maintenance and support untill their Marriage
- Item At the Marriage or death of my wife I give and bequeath to my two sons Posing and James Browder the whole residue of remainder of the tract of Land whereon I now live to be divided equally I share and I share alike to them their heirs and assigns forever
- Item It is my will that at the Marriage or death of my wife that all my negroe not otherwise disposed of be equally divided between all my children Sons and daughters share and share alike and that all my stock of every kind my crop of different kinds Tools and other articles not disposed of be sold and the money arising therefrom be equally divided between all my daughters I share and I share alike after deduction of one hundred and fifty Seven dollars from Jincy Eldredge's part it being the amount of property heretofore given her as mentioned in Section the Second to them and their heirs forever
- Lastly I do nominate constitute and appoint William B Lewis and my sons Dorcas and James Browder as soon as the same at the age of Twenty one years Executors of this my last will and Testament and I do hereby empower the said William B Lewis to act as Executor without giving bond and Security and also to resign his Executorship in case he may wish to do so as soon as my son James arrives at the age of Twenty one years
