arrives to the age of Twenty one years one fourth part of
my tract of land whereon I now live not to include
the mansion House also negro boy Jack to him and
his Heirs forever having already given him my colt
a Horse one year old filly and one sow and pigs

Item I give and Bequeath my Saws and Blacksmith Tools to
my three sons

Item I give and Bequeath to my son Septimus Browder my
tract of land lying in the forks of Holston and
Tennessee rivers Negro boy ABC and a tolerable
good horse whereas he arrives at the age of Twenty one years
until that period arrives it is my will and desire that the
said land be rented out and the rent or profits
arising therefrom after paying the State the instalments
which are or may become due for said land be equally
divided between all my daughters.

Item I give and bequeath to each of my daughters Nancy Judith Polly
Hannah Elizabeth after they come of age and marry and when
requested one Negro to wit the oldest of said daughters to
have the oldest negro not otherwise disposed of and so
on down to the youngest

Item In case I should finally hold my land on the North side of
Clinch after all rents are ended it is my will that my
executors sell the same at their discretion and divide the

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money arising therefrom equally among or between all my daughters
Item It is my will and desire that my executors sell a sufficient quantity of my property
that may be to pay off and discharge all the debts that
may be dues or owing by me as well as to make up whatever
deficiency there may be in paying for a negro girl for my
daughter Jincy Colledge as mentioned in the second section
Item Should any of my Children previous to their marriage choose
to remain with their mother then and in that case they shall be
entitled to so much of the produce or profits arising from the
land and negroes left to my wife as well together with the
property given them be sufficient for their maintenance and
support until their marriage.

Item At the marriage or death of my wife I give and bequeath to my
two Sons Parry and James Browder the whole residue of remainder
of the tract of land whereon I now live to be divided
equally I have and I shall be to them their Heirs
and assigns forever —

It is my will that at the marriage or death of my wife that all my
negroes not otherwise disposed of be equally divided between
all my children Sons and daughters shear and shear alike
and that all my stock of every kind my crop of
different kinds Tools and other articles not disposed of be sold
and the money arising therefrom be equally divided between
all my daughters I have and I shall alike after deducting
one hundred and fifty Seven dollars from Jincy Eldest
part it being the amount of property heretofore given
her as mentioned in Section the Second to them and their
Heirs forever

I do nominate constitute and appoint William B Somer
and my Sons Parry and James Browder as soon as
the time at the age of Twenty one years Executors of
this my last will and testament and also hereby entitling
the said William B Somer to act as Executor without
giving bond and security and also to resign his
Executor ship in case he may wish to do so as soon as
my son James arrives at the age of Twenty one years


