I Give and bequeath to the two children which my said niece Catharine Steel now has a son and daughter my two lots of ground in Davidson in Jefferson County with their appurtenances also a day of ground adjacent to said town to be equally between them when either of them becomes of age wearing out which time it is my will and desire that my niece shall have the use and benefit or profits arising from said lands until she is of age.

I Give and bequeath to my Brother John McFarland my gold and silver Masonic medals to him and his heirs forever Lastly I do name my executor and appoint my niece Catharine Steel Executor to this my last will and Testament
