In the Name of God Amen. I James Clowney being weak in body but of sound mind and disposing Memory do make and Ordain this my last Will and Testament in Manner and form following that is to say. I give my Soul to God who gave it and my body to the Earth to be decently buried. And after the payments of my just debts and funeral expenses. I Will and dispose of my Estate in the following Manner -

To my Beloved Wife Delia I give and bequeath the following Negroes to wit. Yellow Hannah, and her son Davis. And her increase, except her youngest beason, and also black Hannah to her and her heirs forever, to dispose of the same as she pleases.

I also lend to my Wife Delia. Negro man Adam (now in South Carolina) and girl Selina during her Natural life, And after her death it is my will that said Negroes should be sold. And the Money arising from said Sale to be equally divided amongst my four Children Samuel Campbell, Martha Montgomery, Esther Amelia and, Mary Ann Elizabeth. Unless they can agree on a division of them, It is my Will that my Negro Isaac be kept in and become a family charge. Should he ^{be} become incapable of supporting himself. And that he remain under the controul of my Delia who is to have the benefit of his labour.

To my son Samuel Campbell I give and bequeath my Negro boy Edmund. A Saddle horse called Mike. And my two guns to him and his heirs forever

To my Daughter Martha Montgomery I give and bequeath my Negro Boy Jacob and fifteen dollars in Money which was left her by her Grandmother to her and her heirs forever

To my Daughter Esther I give and bequeath my Negro

boy Tim to her and her heirs for ever. To my daughter Mary Ann Elizabeth I give and bequeath the yellow Hannah's second Child Cedar, and one hundred and fifty dollars to her and her heirs forever.

I give and bequeath to my Wife Delia all my household and kitchen furniture

It is my Will and desire that the Stock of different kinds, this years crop or as much as may be needed for the joint support of the family, my Wagon, farm mill - farming tools, and such other things as may be on the place. And not herein disposed of. be kept for the use of the farm and family, or disposed of by my Executors herein after named at their discretion for that purpose And if any surplus of this years crop after purchasing such Articles of comfort, and necessity as the family may want, And also such sums as may be received on any legacy or collected for debts due me, and such as may arise from the sale of my Medical Books, Medicine, And Surgical Instruments (which my Executors are Authorized to sell at private sale) it is my desire that the same after retaining one hundred and fifty dollars for my daughter Mary Ann, above bequeathed be equally divided amongst my four Children herein named

It is my wish and my Executors are Authorized to sell at their discretion and to make deeds for my three lots near Lexington in Rockbridge County Virginia, and also to sell my riding Carriage. And the Monies arising therefrom to be equally divided amongst my Wife Delia and my four Children

I give and bequeath to my Wife Delia the use, possession and enjoyment of my land where I

now lives for and during her Natural life, except One hundred and fifty acres, which was conveyed by A. S. Bacon to Isham Cox the profits of which she is only to have till my son Samuel C. arrives at the age of twenty and years

To my son Samuel C. I give and bequeath that part of my land which was conveyed by Allen S. Bacon to Isham Cox about One hundred and forty acres to be entitled to the possession thereof as soon as he is twenty one year old to him and his heirs forever

The residue of my land where I now live being about four hundred acres At my wifes death I do give and bequeath to my three daughters, Martha Montgomery, Esther Amelia & Mary Ann Elizabeth, to them and their heirs forever, to be equally divided amongst them

Should either of my Children die before arriving at lawful age, to dispose of his or her property it is my Will and desire that the Survivor or Survivors inherit the property of said child or children so deceased

In the name of God Amen. I James Blair of the County of Rowan and State of Tennessee being weak in body, but blessed be God being sound in Memory and also in judgment at this time, do make and acknowledge this to be my last Will and Testament

First. If it should please God to take me out of this World at this time I recommend my Soul to him who gave it to me. And my body to be decently buried

Secondly. I give and bequeath to my loving Wife my black Woman named Nelly, and her oldest daughter Sally, together with their increase. And likewise the boy named Lewis the second son of the black girl named Cady. And likewise my stock of Horses, cattle, hogs, and Sheep I give to her together with their increase to dispose of as she may think proper so that she makes the three youngest boys equal to the two oldest by giving each one horse. I also allow her to have all the debts that is coming to me together with the money that I have on hand, with what the ferry may make, and also the place that I now live on until the Law suit is decided. And after the decision of said suit she is to pay all costs and debts that will be against me. And if there be any balance of money left she can dispose of it to the children as she may think best. If the land on the South side of the River should be lost then I allow my Wife and Brother Hugh to move to the old place and to have possession thereof, during their Natural life. And my Sons John, Hugh and Wiley are to have the profits of the ferry on the North side of the River equally and all the land on the North side after the death of my Wife and Brother Hugh are to be equally divided between them. And Wiley to have the lot placed out if the land on the South side should be gained

or Recovered by Law or any Means, then I allow my son Wiley to have all the land I hold on the South side of the River with all the proceeds that may arise therefrom after the decision of the Just. and Jallors. William Allen and Hugh my sons to have all the my Land and Ferry on the North Side of the River Equal between them. Still reserving the Support and Maintenance of my Wife Jenny and my brother Hugh during their life.

Thirdly. I do bequeath to my Brother Hugh a certain Negro boy named Jack to be his during his lifetime and after his decease to go to my son John as a compensation for loaned Money.

Fourthly. I give and Bequeath to my son John two Black boys named Lewis and Henry Children of Cartley and Greasy, and in case the land on the South side of the River should be lost I allow him one half of the Money coming from Charles McClung, and one half of the Money that will be due me from the State for said land and damages that may be recovered.

Fifthly. I Bequeath to my son William two Negroes the Man named Carter, and his Wife Greasy and the other half of the Money as is stated in the Bequeath to John Blair on the same condition.

Sixthly. I Bequeath to Isabella Prator my daughter two black girls, one named Frank and the other Betsey to her and her heirs forever.

Seventhly. I Bequeath to my daughter Betsey Seates to her and her heirs forever. One Negro girl named Lucy and the child she now has a boy named Mark with the interest I hold on the Lot that she now lives on in Philadelphia Monroe County.

Eighthly. I Bequeath to my son Allen Blair
