I Robert Love being of sound and perfect mind and memory do make and publish this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following first I Give and bequeath unto my wife Lucy Love twenty dollars my reason for not allowing her more than twenty Dollars is because she hath run me in debt on various occasions without my knowledge or consent and in the month of April eighteen hundred and thirty six she eloped with

another man and I have no correct information of her since. I do also Give and bequeath unto my son Josephus Andrew Jackson Love five dollars & I do Give is the child she took away with her on her elopement & It is further my will that John Mc Keavron and Robert C Love be my sole executors to this my last Will and Testament it is my will that executors should sell all my personal property on sweet water Roane County together with the rent corn that will be due to me next fall It is my will that my executors should settle with Henry Chesnut on the debt of my Administration on the Estate of my Brother William Love Deceased in which settlement I am entitled to a credit of thirty to thirty five dollars expenses incurred on account of the funerals of my Brother and sister in law for which I have neglected to take and preserve vouchers I also claim a credit fifty dollars an amount charge to the Estate by me for my trouble in discharge of my duties as an administrator. The principal vouchers with other papers are at William C Julians. I do also will that my executors shall sell all my Land on sweet water Roane County Either at publick or private sale as quick as the nature of the case will authorize their giving a good price for it. It is further my will that my executors shall have all the Right that I have to the remainder yet unsold of my Fathers old farm on the north side of the Great Road including a part of the Town of Loveville Knox County for them to dispose of

as they may judge best for the use and benefit of my two Little daughters viz Amanda Jane and Algiva Adeline Love It is further my will that my Executors pay all dues debts and demands that may be duly and lawfully authenticated against me that they take the Guardian care and charge of my Daughters Amanda J & Algiva A Love to raise nurture and Educate them that they reserve to themselves a reasonable Compensation for their so doing in addition to a Reasonable Compensation for their time and Trouble in discharge of the duties devolving on them in the Execution of the Executorship herein enjoined and that they pay over to and divide equally between my two daughters all the remaining proceeds of my Estate hereby Revoking all former Wills by me made In witness I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this Eighteenth day of June 1837
