We the Commissioners appointed by the County Court of Roane County after first been sworn agree as follows: first we appropriate the Corn that now on hand after taking out fifty Bushels we further appropriate all the poor that on hand together with two fat hogs also what hay is on hand together with three stacks of fodder. Also two different lots of Oats also the Wheat that now on hand Cotton and floor and a small quantity of Irish potatoes also what upper leather that is on hand and three dollars sixty two & a half cents as money to purchase Sole leather. In conclusion we appropriate twenty dollars of money on hand for Iron salt Sugar & Coffee and some other small articles. Given under our hands & seals the date above written.

my sister Sellers a slave And the other twenty dollars
in cash at the discretion of my said Executors to be
given to Hannah a slave of Thomas A. Clark senr.
for her attention in waiting on me in my sickness
not requiring of my said Executors any Vouchers
for the disposition of said legacies

Third It is my will and desire that my Executors pay
over to the Treasurer of the American Colonization
Society or to such other person authorized by said
Society to receive bequests to the same all the Residue or
Remainder of my said Estate after my debts and specific
legacies are paid the said Residue or Remainder
to be applied for the advancement of the objects of
of said Society which said Residue or Remainder
of my Estate I do bequeath to said American
Colonization Society or to the Treasurer thereof
or such person as is authorized to receive bequests
for the same in trust for said Society

Lastly I do hereby appoint my friends William B. Clark Esq.
and Major Thomas A. Clark junr Executors of this
