I Peter Hawkins a free man of color of said State and County being of sound mind and disposing memory do make & publish and declare this to be my last Will and Testament for the disposition of my worldly estate

First It is my will and desire that my Executors hereafter named make sale either publicly or privately of all my Estate both real and personal except One bed bedstead and furniture for cash or on a credit as to them shall seem most advisable and that they proceed to collect such debts as may be due to me at my death and that they my Executors out of the proceeds pay all the debts owing by me

Second It is my will and desire that my said Executors have One bed bedstead & furniture at their discretion to be given to my sister Siller's daughter Soguah a slave belonging to the Estate of Mrs. Martha Smith dec'd and fifty dollars of the cash at their discretion to be given in five equal annual installments to my sister Siller a slave And the other twenty dollars in cash at the discretion of my said Executors to be given to Hannah a slave of Thomas A Clark serv for her attention in waiting on me in my sickness not requiring of my said Executors any vouchers for the disposition of said legacies

Third It is my will and desire that my Executors pay over to the Treasurer of the American Colonization Society or to such other person authorized by said Society to receive bequests to the sum all the residue or remainder of my said Estate after my debts and specific legacies are paid the said residue or remainder to be applied for the advancement of the objects of said Society which said residue or remainder of my Estate I do bequeath to said American Colonization Society or to the Treasurer thereof or such person as is authorized to receive bequests for the same in trust for said Society

Lastly I do hereby appoint my friends William O Clark Esq and Major Thomas A Clark my Executors of this

my last Will & Testament giving them entire discretion in all my business
