in cash at the discretion of my said Executors to be
given to Hannah a slave of Thomas A. Clark senr.
for her attention in waiting on me in my sickness
not requiring of my said Executors any Vouchers
for the disposition of said legacies

Third It is my will and desire that my Executors pay
over to the Treasurer of the American Colonization
Society or to such other person authorized by said
Society to receive bequests to the same all the Residue or
Remainder of my said Estate after my debts and specific
legacies are paid the said Residue or Remainder
to be applied for the advancement of the objects of
of said Society which said Residue or Remainder
of my Estate I do bequeath to said American
Colonization Society or to the Treasurer thereof
or such person as is authorized to receive bequests
for the same in trust for said Society

Lastly I do hereby appoint my friends William B. Clark Esq.
and Major Thomas A. Clark junr Executors of this
