Seventhly, I give and bequeath to Henry Purvis Smith my rifle gun and shot Bag, which I bought at the sale of his Father's property, but they are not to be delivered unto him by my Executors until he arrives to the age of Eighteen years.

Eighthly, the land that formerly belonged to my father adjoining the four town lots herein before bequeathed to John P Patten I likewise bequeath to the said John P Patten at the death of my wife, to his heirs and assigns forever Ninethly, the balance of my real Estate in Roane County, all except such as has herein before been absolutely bequeathed, I wish to be sold by Executors as soon after the death of my wife as they may deem advisable either on a Credit or for Cash in hands as may seem best to them and the proceeds thereof paid over in equal parts to the Children of

my sister Betsy Patten, all except John P Patten, to the Children of Sam'l H Jordan by my niece Betsy Green Combs Dec'd, and to the children of Adolphus H Combs dec'd Sixthly, there is a grant issued by the State of Tennessee to James Taylor for five thousand acres of land, also a Grant for about two thousand acres issued to me and John Alexander, and two grants to Samuel G Cloney for some land, the amount not now recollect which land was afterwards transferred to me by said Cloney, the one half of which land in those four grants belongs to W S Ell Coven and the other half to me - My interest in those lands as well as all other lands I have in Morgan County in this State or the beginning corners of which are in said Morgan County, my Executors may dispose of on the best terms they can at such times as they may think proper and pay over the proceeds to my wife -

Eleventhly, Having Confidence in my Executors herein after named, I do not require them to give any security for the performance of their duties, nor do I require them to be bound to comply with the requirements of the law now in force or that may be passed for the government of Executors but allow them to manage the business of my estate as they in their discretion may deem advisable, and I also authorise my Executors to exercise their discretion in the settling of all Claims due to me or from me, authorising them to pay all those against me that they consider just whether barred by the laws of the land or not and authorising them in the settlement of any claims due to me to arrange them in any way they may consider to the best interest of my Estate

Lastly - I do hereby make ordain and appoint my friends Thomas A Clark Jun'r and William S Ell Coven Executors of this my last will and testament, hereby revoking and making void all former wills by me at any time heretofore made.
