Sixthly, I give and bequeath unto my sister Betsey Patton One Cherry Corner Cupboard

Seventhly, I give and bequeath to Henry Purvis Smith my rifle gun and shot Bag, which I bought at the sale of his father's property, but they are not to be delivered unto him by my Executors until he arrives to the age of Eighteen years

Eighthly, the land that formerly belonged to my father adjoining the four town lots hereinbefore bequeathed to John P Patton, I likewise bequeath to the said John P Patton at the death of my wife ^{and} to his heirs and assigns forever

Ninthly, the balance of my real Estate in Boone County, all except such as has hereinbefore been absolutely bequeathed, I wish to be sold by my Executors as soon after the death of my wife as they may deem advisable, either on a credit or for cash on hand as may seem best to them, and the proceeds thereof paid over in equal parts to the Children of

my sister Betsey Patton, all except John P Patton, to the Children of David H Jordan by my niece Betsey Emma Cumble Dec^d and to the Children of Adolphus H Cumble dec^d Tenthly, there is a grant issued by the State of Tennessee to James Taylor for five thousand acres of land, also a Grant for about two thousand acres issued to one and John Alexander, and two grants to Samuel C Clowney for some land, the amount not now recited which land was afterwards transferred to one by said Clowney, the One half of which land in these four grants belongs to W S C Ewen and the other half to me - my interest in those lands, as well as all other land I have in Morgan County, in this State or the beginning Corners of which are in said Morgan County, my Executors may dispose of on the best terms they can at such times, as they may think proper and pay over the proceeds to my wife -

Eleventhly, Having Confidence in my Executors hereinafter named I do not require them to give any security for the performance of their duties nor do I require them to be bound to comply with the requirements of the law now in force or that may be passed for the government of Executors but allow them to manage the business of my estate as they in their discretion may deem advisable, and I also authorize my Executors to exercise their discretion in the settling of all claims due to me or from me, authorizing them to pay all those against me that they consider just whether barred by the laws of the land or not and authorizing them in the settlement of any claims due to me to arrange them in any way they may consider to the best interest of my Estate

Lastly, - I do hereby make, ordain and appoint my friends Thomas H Clark Jun^r and William S C Ewen Executors of this my last will and testament, hereby revoking and making void all former wills by me at any time heretofore made, In Witness whereof Henry S Purvis the said Testator have to this my will written on one sheet of paper, set my hand and seal this 29th day of
