Item 9th It is my will and desire that my son William Cooper McKamy should live with his mother take charge of her property and support her during her life.

Item 10th It is my will and desire at the death of my wife Margaret that the property I have given to her shall be equally divided between my two sons Franklin Perry and William Cooper McKamy.

Item 11th If there is not money enough on hand with the debts that are owing to me to pay all my just debts then it is my will and desire that my Executors in their discretion dispose of such of my property as they may deem proper for that purpose.
