McKinney of Roane County State of Tennessee being in a weak state of body and impeded with a belief that I cannot live long but of sound and disposing mind and memory and being desirous to dispose of the worldly substance wherewith God has been pleased to bless me in this world do make and ordain the to be my last will and Testament which is as follows to wit.

Item 1st It is my will and bequeath my soul to God who gave it and my body to the earth from which it came

Item 2nd It is my will and desire that my executors herein after named give my body a decent burial & that my funeral expenses be first paid

Item 3rd It is my will and desire that all my just debts be paid

Item 4th I give & bequeath to my wife Margaret three of my negroes to wit Henry Mary and John during her natural life I also give to my wife Margaret one third of all my house hold and kitchen furniture one third of the farming utensils one young mare called Diana and one horse mule also one third of my cattle sheep and hog that may be on hand at the time of my death.

Item 5th I give & bequeath to my son Franklin Berry McKinney my negro man Bob to him and his heirs forever also one horse named Charly and one mare male named Ginny also one third of my stock of cattle sheep and hog and one third of my house hold & kitchen furniture together with one third of my

farming interests.

Item 6th I do further give & bequeath to my son Franklin Perry his heirs & assigns forever a tract of land lying and being in the County of Roan State of Tennessee about four miles East of Kingston and known as the corner stone tract and on which William Brannam now lives and the same purchased of James White by me supposed to contain three hundred and ninety three acres.

Item 7th I give & bequeath to my son William Cooper McKamy and his heirs forever my negro man Nelson also two mules one by the name of Soddy and one White mule without name one third of my stock of cattle sheep and hogs one third of my house hold and kitchen furniture and one third of my farming interests.

Item 8th I give and bequeath to my son William Cooper his heirs and assigns forever a tract of land lying and being in the County of Roan State of Tennessee on the waters of the Tennessee River and on which I now live containing two hundred and sixty four acres.

Item 9th It is my will and desire that my son William Cooper McKamy should live with his mother take charge of her property and support her during her life.

Item 10th It is my will and desire at the death of my wife Margaret that the property I have given to her shall be equally divided between my two sons Franklin Perry and William Cooper McKamy.

Item 11th If there is not money enough on hand with the debts that am owing to me to pay all my just debts then it is my will and desire that my executors in their discretion dispose of such of my property as they may deem proper for that purpose.

Item 12th It is my wish and desire that the provisions on hand shall be and for the common benefit of my family.

Item 13th If there should be any other property that has been overlooked and not disposed of by this my last will and Testament it is my will and desire that the same be equally divided between my wife Margaret & my two sons Franklin Perry and William Cooper McKamy.
