First It is my desire that so soon after my death as
possible my executor herein after named shall dispose
of my personal estate collect such debts as are due to me
and pay off all the just debts that are owing by me, and
if there should not be sufficient of my personal estate to
pay my debts then my said executor are authorized to sell
my lands or such part as may be necessary and my
said executor and my said executors are authorized
to make sales either publicly or privately

Second It is my desire with so much that after my debts
are paid and my family raised that then the balance
if any be equally divided between my four children
or their survivors, to wit Henry Smith, Alexander Smith
Mary Smith, Sarah Smith & Edward Smith

Third It is my wish that my executors rent out my farm
if it is not necessary to sell the same and apply the proceeds
to the payment of debts if necessary and the balance to be
equally appropriated for the benefit of my said children
Whereas I have at note now in the Branch Bank of Tennessee at
Athens & Co hereby authorize my executors to receive my said

note from time to time and pay the same out of my estate
and as my executor John H. Smith is indebted to me, and by
our contract the amount was to be paid by installments and
my said note on Bank I wish the said money to be applied
in that way, unless my said executor shall think it most
advisable to have it applied in some other way

It is my wish that my executors herein after named
shall have full power to act in and sell my business the
same as I might myself & not requiring them to act in
strict conformity to the law, but to act in any way that
they make think in their discretion most conducive to
the interest of my estate, and as I have full confidence
in the execution herein after named I do not wish them to give
security for the execution of this my will Lastly I appoint
my brother John H. Smith & Henry S. Purvis my executors

Thirdly, I will and bequeath to my wife Esther Amelia Purvis her heirs and assigns forever the place on which I now live containing twelve acres more or less, and I also will and bequeath to her during her life all the Balance of my real estate in the County of Boone and State of Tennessee -

Fourthly, I will and bequeath to my wife during her life my negro girl Rhoda and her two Children -

George, Helen and Joseph and her future increase - all of which negroes are to be set free at the death of my wife or as soon thereafter as practicable, provided my Executors should in their discretion deem it proper they should have their freedom -

Fifthly, I give unto my wife all my personal Estate whatever kind I may die possessed of, after settling the legacies hereinafter mentioned -

Sixthly, I give and bequeath unto my sister Betsey Patton One Cherry Corner Cupboard

Seventhly, I give and bequeath to Henry Purvis Smith my rifle gun and shot Bag, which I bought at the sale of his father's property, but they are not to be delivered unto him by my Executors until he arrives to the age of Eighteen years

Eighthly, the land that formerly belonged to my father adjoining the four town lots hereinbefore bequeathed to John P Patton, I likewise bequeath to the said John P Patton at the death of my wife ^{unto} to his heirs and assigns forever

Ninthly, The balance of my real Estate in Boone County, all except such as has hereinbefore been absolutely bequeathed, I wish to be sold by my Executors as soon after the death of my wife as they may deem advisable, either on a credit or for cash on hand as may seem best to them, and the proceeds thereof paid over in equal parts to the Children of
