 give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Mary
 Grimes one hundred and twenty acres of land

 State aforesaid being part of a tract of six hundred
 and twenty acres I bought of Rodgers
 and which includes the dwelling house together
 with all the improvements also part of another
 tract which I bought of Benjamin King adjoining
 the premises before described, supposed to contain

give and bequeath unto my son Daniel Grimes
one hundred and sixty acres of land it being
